1. RULES

1.1 This regatta will be governed by the "rules" as defined in the 2009-2013 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS); and as modified by: the Optimist Class Rules, the sailing instructions and this Notice of Race.

1.2 RRS 40 is changed to apply at all times while on the water. regardless of whether or not code flag "Y" is flown.

1.3 Competitors must have a whistle attached to their life vest.

1.4 RRS 82 will not apply.

1.5 RRS 61.1 (2) will be changed to require a boat to display a red flag if she intends to protest concerning an incident in the racing area.

1.6 RRS 61 will be changed to inform a race committee boat immediately after finishing of its intention to protest another boat and provide the sail number of the protested boat.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

2.1 This regatta is open to International Optimist Dinghy class boats.

2.2 Each entrant must submit a completed MBYC Entry Form prior to 1000 hours on Saturday, March 20th. All competitors must have their Entry Form signed by a parent or guardian. Entry forms and check in will also be available on Friday pm.

2.3 Fleet assignments (other than green fleet) will be based on the competitor's age on the first day of the regatta. Skippers can race Optimists until they turn 16 years old . Green fleet is for beginners in order to encourage novice sailors up to the age of 16.

3. FEES: The cost to enter the regatta is \$ 40.00. The fee includes, the race, Saturday night dinner ticket and the regatta “T” shirt.

4. SCHEDULE

Ten (10) races are scheduled: The race committee will try to get as many races on Saturday as is practical. The remaining races of the scheduled ten will be run on Sunday. Note; the Race Committee may run fewer races than the scheduled ten at its discretion.

There will be an on-the-water lunch break between races both days.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available at the MBYC check-in table beginning Friday evening March 19th

7. VENUE

Race Committee intends for Green Fleet and Championship fleets to race in separate starts north of mooring fields between channel markers 10 and 8 .

An alternate course for Green fleet may be used between the mooring fields in the southern part of the navigable channel.

8. COURSES

Courses will be primarily windward, leeward with some reaching legs if weather permits.

9. SCORING

The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply. Two (2) races must be completed to constitute a regatta. Appendix A2 is modified as follows: If five or more races are completed the boats score will be the total of her scores excluding her worst score.

10. SUPPORT BOATS

10.1 Competitors who wish to keep support boats at MBYC must make arrangements with the Port Captain or Rear Commodore for use of the hoist, trailer storage and in-the- water berthing. Contact, MBYC port captain

10.2 Only boats that have registered with the Race Committee (RC) and carry assigned identification will be allowed in the racing area. All individuals on such registered boats are required to wear PFDs and have a functioning marine radio on board.

11. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded after racing on Sunday to the first through third place boat in each class and participation awards for green fleet.

12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers (organizing authority, host yacht club, race committee, protest committee, sponsors, and any others acting in an official capacity for this event) from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law..

13. FURTHER INFORMATION

13.1 Tows. Courtesy tows to the racing area will be available in the vicinity of the launch area; however, it is the responsibility of each competitor to be at the start on time.

13.2 Hospitality. Competitors and their guests are invited to use club facilities on race days. There will be a Taco Dinner Saturday night after racing. (Tickets will be \$8.00) Refreshments will be available following racing on Sunday.
