#### FROM THE PORT CAPTAIN'S DOCK



I have found it difficult and confusing to keep track of the boats in storage—mooring, rack, and backyard. In order to simplify the job, we will resume the use of a boat storage agreement. It will apply to all storage areas: moorings, kayak rack, and backyard. As soon as the Board approves the form, it will be available from me,

from the office, or on-line for you to download and return to me signed. The purpose of the agreement is to make sure that all are aware of what is expected of boat owners and make the Port Captain's job a bit easier. As it is now, someone will come to me to ask to put a boat in the yard, but they do not always tell me when they will be removing a boat from the spot. How do I know what space is available or when it is available, so I can assign it to someone else, and maximize the revenue from the storage areas? It will benefit the club's bottom line by avoiding empty spaces.

Please make an effort to get the agreement, read, sign, and return it to me as soon as possible. I appreciate your efforts to have these complete and on file asap.

By the way, thank you to all who have so quickly responded to my previous efforts to identify their sports and boats. Taking this one more step—the signed agreement will be clearer for all.

Next, an unpleasant situation: There has been some damage done to boats and trailers in the backyard (the boat storage yard) by unknown persons at an unknown time. It is distressing to hear that members have so little self respect, or respect for our friends, that the accidents were not admitted or an offer to repair the damage was not forthcoming. Please take care when taking your craft into and out of the yard.

The dues are in and I think I see daylight! This learning by fire has taught me I need help from everyone. Soooo...HELP! When any member charges at the bar, Please, Please PRINT your full name CLEARLY and add your account number, <u>not</u> your membership

number. Jim Phillips has to go cross-eyed at times figuring out who bought what. Often he has to leave the guessing to me. ALSO, if you are authorized to charge on account for something purchased for the club, when you sign for the purchase, ALSO PRINT YOUR FULL NAME AND FOR WHAT THE ITEM IS TO BE USED.

Tracking expenses for the budget is important. The budget has many categories and more often than not I don't know special projects or repairs that are being taken care of by members. If a member purchases something with his/her own money, turn in the receipt/ invoice and print your name and for what it was purchased. I pay bills weekly, so your reimbursement will arrive quickly IF I know who and what. PLEASE DO NOT DEDUCT AMOUNTS TO BE REIMBURSED FROM YOUR MONTHLY BILLING.

I have also learned that the treasurer is dependent on the Port Captain and the Membership Chairman. The membership chairman adds, deletes, or changes all membership information in the computer, which in turn affects the billings. All boat information comes to the treasurer from the Port Captain. For me to start billing, stop billing, or change billing on boats, the port captain has to tell me. So please e-mail Lynn anytime there is a change.

Thank you to everyone for being patient during my learning curve, which, by the way, is still going on...I just discovered the taxes!!!!!!

#### Spring 2 Ocean Race – 4 April 2004

The MBYC club racing buoy is MIA even after Mitch's valiant and eventful hunt with the park ranger. But then maybe Mitch got distracted. The race was scheduled as the Devlin Series race #2, but without either our beloved Radar buoy or the club buoy, the race was swapped with Spring #2.

The race course was from the harbor entrance buoy, MB-1, to Constantine Rock buoy (above Cayucos near China Cove), back to MB-1 then out to 18EB (known to locals as 10E and by some simply as "gong") and back to MB-1 for a course length of a little over 14 miles.

The day started out overcast with nearly zero wind, but the flags started to flutter as the morning progressed. The wind was pretty light at the start, about 5 to 8 knots as I recall. All the boats started without incident, Iceman, *Whizbang* and *Voyager II* were within seconds of each other near the MB-1 buoy. *Glisade, Califia* and *Guyacan* started closer to the rock. As expected, Iceman took the lead and pulled away from the rest of us. *Voyager* and *Whizbang* were closely engaged for a while after the start as *Whizbang* tried to roll Voyager but was rebuffed each time until we decided that it was time to head for the mark instead of doing a tactical duel.

As we neared Constantine, the wind freshened to 12 - 14 knots true and surprisingly veered toward North; it seems to me that we usually get lifted as we go toward

Cayucos on port tack. *Iceman* and *Whizbang* must have correctly predicted the wind shift since they both stood further offshore than *Voyager* and were able to lay Constantine on a single tack. To our dismay, we had to tack out and back to get to Constantine. There wasn't too much kelp at Constantine. In the past it has been a factor. I can remember boats getting completely stopped by the kelp as they rounded Constantine. I believe the order of rounding was: Iceman, *Whizbang, Voyager II, Glisade, Califia*, and *Guyacan*.

The next leg was, for most boats, a nice long spinnaker run. During this leg *Voyager* slid under *Whizbang* and assumed 2<sup>nd</sup> place (uncorrected). *Iceman* was still pulling away in front. I don't know of any lead changes during the rest of the race. We all took our on times and reported them to Bette. At the finish line we compared our time with an approximate finish time for *Whizbang* and were pretty sure that we had saved our time. A big surprise happened in the awards meeting when Bette announced that *Voyager* had beaten *Iceman* by 10 seconds (corrected).

*Voyager II* is blessed by having a long-term consistent crew. I consider that as our secret weapon. When we race, we generally have 50 to 60 years of *Voyager II* racing experience aboard. The present crew is Mark Beem, Candy Botich, Emery Gall, Paul Irving, Kevin O'Day, Gustavo Prieto, and Drew Wise.



April was a great month for Fleet 128 Day Sailers. We started our month with the final race of the Lopez Lake series. The fleet then traveled to Richmond for the first of the regional series. Finally, the fleet met on April 14 for a meeting concerning the upcoming Fleet Champions race and the Morro Bay Invitational. Additionally, the fleet is now beginning a six-week blast which starts at Lake Millerton on the 17<sup>th</sup> of April, then back to Morro Bay for Spring 2 the following weekend, then off to Lake Piru on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May, Back to Morro Bay for the final in the Spring Series, up to the B ay Area, for a Regional at Redwood City, and then back to Morro bay for the Fleet Champs. A very busy six weeks for the fleet.

The Lopez Lake series was put on by San Luis Yacht Club. This was the last of the three races, with the first race being a bit of a mess and the second race canceled. The entire trophy was decided by the outcome of this full weekend bonanza.

Saturday was simple enough: three races, in light to variable winds. John Neiswanger started off well, taking a first, with Student Driver and Running with Scissors following closely behind. Race two saw Peter and Anita Rothenbuecher off to an early lead, with *Student Driver* in close tow, followed by John Neiswanger. As luck would have it, the first two boats headed off in different and wrong courses, leaving Neiswanger an easy first-place finish, with Lolo and Lex again finishing third. The third race was a repeat of race one, so Student Driver and team Rothenbuecher managed to go the right way. Finishes were Student Driver first, Lemon Head second, and Running with Scissors third. At the end of the day, it was Lemon Head with 4 points in first, Running with Scissors in second with 9 points, and Student Driver barely in third by one point above the next place boat, a large cat boat from SLYC.

On day two of the Lopez series, the fleet met with light and variable winds, changing to 10 and constant winds. For race one, the San Luis Yacht Club sent us down to the dam; it was a great spinnaker run all the way. Then we came back uphill in light to no wind all the way home; how do you say long race? At the end of the day, John Neiswanger won the day and his name on the perpetual trophy at the San Luis Yacht Club.

Enough truly cannot be said about the San Luis Yacht Club and the way they can really put on a great race, feed, and house us in a very friendly manner. Saturday night we had a trophy ceremony for the day and a fantastic barbecue with tri-tip, salad, and chocolate cake. Sunday we were greeted with a great breakfast of tri-tip, eggs, and muffins. Kudos to Hans and the entire crew at SLYC!

The fleet also went to Richmond and raced inside of the San Francisco bay, the course being directly behind Angel Island for two days. Richmond had the Day Sailer's race in the bay sharing a starting line with International 14s, International Canoes, International Moths, the Wylie cats, and the Lightnings. This was a great place to race. We had good wind, 12-20 knots, and a good variable environment with 2- to 3-oot waves that would occasionally make themselves a nuisance by breaking into the boat.

We had two races on day one and one long "pursuit race" on day two. Race one saw a heavily competitive line with twelve boats hitting the short line on time. When driving uphill, you had to drive around, over, and back up the waves. Conversely downhill, the Day Sailers would plane under a full complement of sails, while you tried to stay onto of the waves as long as possible. This was a great venue and I recommend that all of the members of Fleet 128 give it a go. That is the bulk of it for April. Cheers.

#### Bylaws Change Adopted at November 2003 General Meeting Student Membership

This is a bylaws change to offer a Student Membership at the Morro Bay Yacht Club. Proposed changes are as follows.

#### **ARTICLE VI: MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1. Membership shall consist of (6) classes: Regular, Associate, Honorary, Life, Student and Members of the Morro Bay Junior Yacht Club. (Hereinafter referred to as MBJYC)

- F. Student Membership shall be open to a full time student enrolled in an accredited University, College, or Community College and is of age 21 to age 25. He or she must be a registered full time student and not miss more than one quarter or one semester in one year. Student members may not vote, hold office, or sponsor new members in either the MBYC or the MBJYC. A student member will not have bar privileges. Privileges, responsibilities and fees for student membership will be the same as that of the MBJYC.
- Section 6. Applicants for student membership in the MBYC must submit a properly completed application form signed by two regular or life members of the MBYC. In addition, applicants for student membership must show and maintain a GPA of 2.0 or better.
