MEMBERSHIP NEWS

Ahoy fellow boaters,

Well, the membership corner has been busy with sponsors handing out **Sponsor Packets** to prospective members. If you are interested in sponsoring someone who is interested in membership and are not sure of how to go about it, **here are the steps to accepting a new member:**

- Step 1 – Both sponsors are given a sponsor packet. Each sponsor returns the completed questionnaire.
- Step 2 – The sponsors meet with the membership committee to discuss eligibility of the perspective member.
- Step 3 – If eligibility is met, an application is given to the sponsors to give to the prospective member.
- Step 4 – Once the application is returned (with initiation fee), the application is posted at the clubhouse and announced in the Masthead.
- Step 5 – At the next available Board Meeting, both sponsors speak on behalf of the applicant. The board votes.

Below are the requirements for sponsoring a prospective member. These requirements are noted in both the **Policy Letter 15** and in the **MBYC By-Laws**

- The sponsor should have known the applicant for a minimum of 6 months.
- The sponsor shall be strongly supportive of the applicant and have shared boating activities with the applicant.
- The sponsor will inform the applicant of the initiation fees and dues.
- The applicant must participate in the minimum of four club activities, two of which must be boating activities.
- The sponsor must introduce the applicant to as many club members as possible and all board members prior to vote by the Board of Directors.

The sponsor must be present at the Board of Directors meeting that is acting on the application of the person(s) they are sponsoring.

If you have any additional questions or would like a sponsor packet, please let me know.

By now, you should have received the new **2006 Roster**. Thank you to those who turned in the roster change form. Since there was a flood of changes to be made, they will not be published in this month's Masthead. Continuing next month, updates to membership such as address changes, resignations, etc. will continue. So please review the new roster for fellow member's updates. If there are any corrections, please resubmit a roster change form, and we'll be sure to get into next year's roster. Since this was a volunteer project, we appreciate your patience if there are any errors.

Also, one last reminder, the following members will be up for vote for **Life Membership in this month's General Meeting**. Requirements for Life membership is 25 years of uninterrupted membership and has attained the age of 65, as stated in the By-Laws. (See names below).

FROM YOUR REAR COMMODORE



Again, another big month for racing both in and outside of the bay. Four races have transpired since I last wrote to all of you eager readers. The Bay Fleet held Spring 2, Lopez Lake series at Santa Margarita, Opening Day and the first of the Devlin series.

The Devlin series transpired immediately ahead of the next incoming storm. Four boats attended this Ocean race. In finishing order they were Lynn Meissen 1st, Wayne Ratliff 2nd, Pandora Nash-Karner 3rd, and John Michener 4th. Winds were light and flukey at first filling into a good breeze as the day developed. It was a good reaching race with some upwind work and very little downwind work. The Ocean fleet did not hold Opening Day due to sloppy seas and cold and strong winds. Two boats did show up, Lynn Meissen and Pandora Nash-Karner, but both retired before getting beat up.

The Bay fleet held Spring 2. Light and steady winds prevailed. The race committee this time held the races off of the Bomber with the start line running so the boats headed directly towards an upwind mark near the sand spit. The start line was very close to square to the wind which I strongly recommend every PRO to attempt to obtain. Racers started, then rounded a mark directly upwind, then around the course, finally going around the weather mark finishing dead downwind. In the DaySailer Michael and Brooks Measures took 1st, John Taylor and Jean Fergus 2nd, Susan Wiley and Victor Nigro 3rd, Tom Murphy 4th. Also in the DaySailer Sam and Earnie Studer 1st, John and daughter Hilary Rothrock 2nd, Jack Daily 3rd, and Joni and Lewis Wells 4th. Lasers saw Lex Budge win over Ron Giddings. Fleets absent: Lido's and CFJ's.

On March 12th five hearty DaySailers headed up in a snow storm to race the second in the Lopez Lake series. We stopped along the way for photos in the snow then went about the business of racing. All told seven boats showed up at Lake Santa Margarita, two from San Luis Yacht Club, and five from the Morro Bay Yacht Club. Two new members have been hitting every race that they can. Lewis and Joni Wells bought into Victor Nigro's Daysailer and have put it to great use ever since. Also in attendance Tom Murphy and Tiffany Smart, Karl Derdorf and Dan, Earnie Studer and Victor Nigro, and Gail Condon and Kevin Williams.

Finally we come to the Opening Day. This year Opening Day was followed by a good deal of carnage. Two boats out of the five entered bent their masts up. Of the other three entered one did not sail and one was constantly swimming (laser).



Races were held in gusty conditions, winds averaged in the early double digits. In race one boats went up to channel marker 10 back to 14, up to 12 and then finish. Student Driver piloted by a prospective member was first around 10 with Andrew Brown and Joss Giddings in close tow. After some wild experimenting with a spinnaker set they finally were off at a great clip. Then came the broach, the hurried douse and on around the race course. Andrew Brown took the first race followed by prospective member, Joss in third, and Jim Orth rounding out the fleet. Race two was a little bit different. Leg one saw Student Driver first at the top mark with blazing pointing and speed Andrew close behind, and Joss doing his best to stay upright planing downhill. Jim Orth went for a quick dip with his crew and began to retire back to the club. However, Jim's rig had different plans and toppled in the most interesting of ways, falling forward with all wires still properly attached. Oddly enough it seems that the foot of the mast must remain attached in order for the mast to stay upright, who would have thought it.

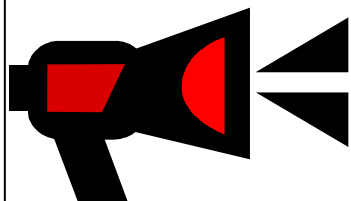


FROM THE PORT CAPTAIN'S DOCK

Ocean Fleet News

It already seems like a long time ago, but our Winter 3 race was held on February 19, two days after I submitted my last column. Voyager II took first, Whizbang second, and Nanka third, with Kiskedee rounding out the fleet. The day was topped off with a Hamburger Night-style barbecue following the race. The racers want to thank Rachelle Phillips, Char Bruzenak, Gail Condon, Judy Salamacha, and Susan Wiley for putting their free time into feeding hungry racers.

March kicked-off with the Devlin 1 race on the 5th, with our Rear Commodore serving as pro. I don't want to deprive him of the opportunity to tell tall tails about the event, so I refer you to his column for details.

The postponed Winter 1 was finally held on March 19. The starting boats included Voyager II (Norseman 447), Whizbang (C&C33), Guayacan (Alden 43), Califia (Islander 28), and Tom's Foolery (Venture 22-2). Tom's Foolery was entered by Tom Wright, a resident of Los Osos who also crews on a SLYC boat. We were joined by Michael Dobrzensky, the chair of San Luis Yacht Club's ocean race committee. Whizbang and Voyager II were short on crew, so I joined Whizbang and Michael found a billet aboard Voyager II.

The course was MB to Mouse Rock to Constantine to 10EB and finish. There was a small craft advisory for NW winds 15 to 25 knots and combined seas 10 to 12 feet having a dominant period of 10 seconds forecast

The winds were no more than 11 knots when we hit the starting line. The entire fleet got a very good start, with Whizbang over the line first just 2 seconds behind the starting time. I can assure that Whizbang was not over the line early, as the race committee had superior position to other observers in making the determination.

The winds built to just over 20 knots halfway to Mouse Rock. Voyager II pushed smartly ahead, while Guayacan easily kept pace just behind Whizbang, followed by Califia. We later learned that Tom's Foolery retired and had a blast surfing back to the harbor.

Whizbang and Guayacan reached the first mark together. Whizbang used the tack as an opportunity to shorten sail, but fouled Guayacan and took her penalty turns after getting the headsail changed

Voyager II was the only boat to fly a spinnaker after rounding Constantine, and was far ahead of the fleet at the finish. Whizbang crossed second, with Guayacan only 42 seconds behind, followed by Califia. Guayacan took first place on corrected time, with Voyager II second and Whizbang third. The win put Guayacan in third place standing for the Winter Series with 13 points, Whizbang in second with 6 points, and Voyager II in first with 5 points.

We were all out of trophies, but Manny Fimbres has been

lining up sponsors for future prizes. I will announce the efforts of Manny's efforts once I have closed the deals.

The club mark has gone off station or been lost four times in as many years. I have been researching ways to improve upon that before setting a new buoy. I have also made contacts with various suppliers so I can get some estimated costs to use in deciding how to anchor the mark. I hope I will be able to report the club mark is back in place by the next edition of the Masthead.

April 2 we will be racing for the Pritchett Spring Series Trophy. The race will have a 12-mile course with a Bermuda start beginning north of Lion Rock to enable boats from the San Luis Yacht Club to participate. The skipper's meeting will be held over the VHF and the first boat will start at 1115 to give everyone time to return to port at a reasonable time. We will invite our friends from the SLYC for a potluck barbecue at 5 pm following the race. Bring your own meat and something to share even if you aren't racing that day:




