# Ocean Fleet News

A series of unfortunate events resulted in a flurry of e-mails and last minute changes to our planned race with the San Luis Yacht Club on April 2. The plan was to meet boats from the SLYC to race a triangular course north of Lion Rock. The weather looked ominous, the boat from SLYC that was to set the outer mark cancelled for safety reasons, and only one boat was coming up from Port San Luis. At noon on the day before the race I instructed everyone to meet at the club for the usual 1030 skippers meeting for a more usual race.

The course was from the MB buoy to the Point Buchon buoy and back using a Bermuda start. The participants, in order of start, were Guayacan, Califia, Wings, Nanka, Kiskedee, Whizbang, and Voyager II. The forecast was for partly cloudy skies, south winds 10 to 15 knots, and 2 foot seas.

Some of the boats stayed close to shore while others went out in search of fresher breezes. Because of the southerlies, it was a long upwind tack to Pt. Buchon. About half-way to the first mark the winds eased a bit, followed by a


light rain and freshening breeze. The winds started to ease again on the leg home.
