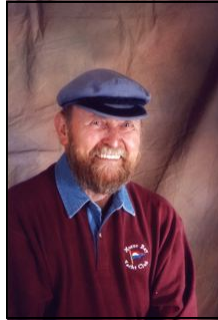

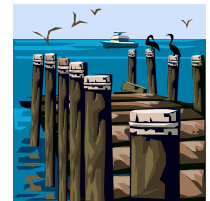

FROM YOUR VICE COMMODORE

Whew! We made it. The club was almost totally back together after the flood in time for Opening Day.

I give my deepest thanks to Commodore John Schmidt for his words on Opening Day and to the response from the members regarding the flood and the repairs. But I can only accept that honor as a representative of the membership that did the actual work. I always felt that the club was fully behind me and completely supportive.

First off, there was the first response group that worked for two days immediately following the flood to mop up water, remove sodden carpet padding and start the drying process. Then there was Kit Lockwood and her committee that began the tricky process of selecting new carpeting and tile. Peter



Rothenbuecher was helping from the start to counsel us on how to replace the damaged floor coverings and later to do the actual job. I made several calls on Don Lockwood's alias list for help in moving the upstairs furniture and books and got huge turnouts. Commodore John

moved all the chairs upstairs singlehandedly. Kevin Williams did all the drywall work in the hallway and repair work in the foyer. Jim Bruzenak helped frequently on various projects, including a lot of interior painting and rerouting the door lock wiring. Rear Commodore John Michener replaced all the plastic plumbing with braided stainless steel so that a similar flood should not happen again. Todd Hansen consulted with us for the floor coverings and the acous-

tic ceiling tile. Several *ad hoc* teams removed the downstairs tile, baseboard, emptied and later reassembled the race closet. Lee Drocco got me down from the stratosphere several times when dealing with the insurance company and the flood remediation group. The officers and directors were totally supportive. They always said "Do what you need to do, we will support any decision you make". And finally, the members in general were supportive in taking the damaged clubhouse in stride, even enjoying the revealed Rhodes 33 lofting lines for the bar that are drawn on the plywood subfloor. This repair job was a vast collaborative project that we all did and we all deserve the credit for. Last November, I paraphrased Sir Isaac Newton about standing on the shoulders of giants, well this year I have found even bigger giants.



I also want to thank the continuing work day workers. Bev & Roy Gammill, Ann & Andy Brennan, and Susan Wiley continued painting and all the other members who worked so hard to get the clubhouse ready for opening day.

So what's next on the list? Is it a new galley floor, dumb waiter, continued cable railing, or will the elevator be raised again (so to speak)? Stay tuned.

FROM YOUR REAR COMMODORE



A Racing Clinic and Seminar will be held at 10:00 AM on Saturday, May 31st. Several topics will be covered. I have convinced the Fab-Four to return and do the presentations similar to what they have given in the past. Plus, I have a guest speaker from the Harbor Patrol, who is going to speak to us about techniques,

and considerations regarding rescue of people from capsized boats, and possibly other topics. This should be of interest to anyone who is a boater, but especially to people who will be on the race committee safety boat. Lex Budge will acquaint people with the operation of the Whaler launch. Gail Condon and Doug Gould will talk about how to PRO and act as Race Committee for a bay race. This is useful to someone who is willing to help by doing these jobs occasionally but also it gives a racer insight into what is happening on the deck during a race. Ron Giddings will teach a session on racing rules and answer questions. All of these people do a great job of presenting the topics. I want to thank them, in advance, for agreeing to give up their Saturday morning to do this for us. I'm hoping we have a good turn out. Also, Michael Measures will be doing measurement for the Daysailer Fleet that morning, which will be of interest to some people.

The Ocean Fleet had two races in April, the Spring 1 on the 6th and the Devlin 1 on the 13th. The results for the Spring 1 race are that Savage Lady finished 3rd, Kiskedee finished 2nd and Whizbang finished 1st. The wind for the Devlin 1 was very unpredictable and for long periods nonexistent. Out of the five boats that started the race, only Whizbang finished.

The Bay Fleet had the Spring 2 on April 12th and then Opening Day on April 20th and Spring 3 scheduled for April 26th.

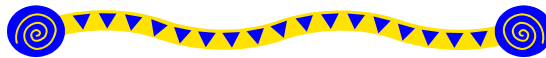


Daysailer Fleet 128 News

Happy Spring Juniors!

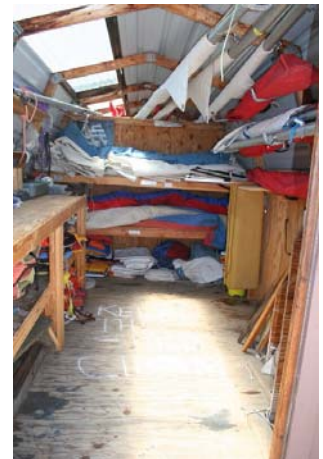
