

# FROM YOUR VICE COMMODORE

There's not much to report this time (but that must be good news), just a lot of little things going on, "background noise" in engineering terms.

The August board approved increasing the level of the janitorial service. For the last four months we have had once a week service which just isn't enough, especially with Summer Sailing and Hamburger nights. The revised service is on Monday and Thursday nights. I think the increased service is working well, what are your thoughts? Now that Summer Sailing and Hamburgers are done, we'll get the carpets professionally cleaned.

Also with board approval, Donna Arozena began to chair a committee to investigate options to re-tile or re-cover the galley floor. We believe that the original tiles were not sealed. Over the years, grease has soaked deep into the tile so that no soap, chemical, or heat cleaning will touch it. At the same time, I hope her committee will advise on new shades for the downstairs dining area. After her son's severe traffic accident, Donna has resigned and passed on the baton to Todd Hansen. I understand that the favored options are a vinyl covering or an epoxy coating. In all likelihood, the galley floor will not be re-done this year due to the heavy usage between Thanksgiving and Christmas/New Year activity.

Thanks to John Michener for donating a dolly even before I had asked for it. It was cleverly hidden in the shed.

Is anyone missing a Craftsman cordless drill and/or a riveting tool, maybe from work day? If I understood the note correctly, they were left behind the bar.

Although not strictly in the Vice Commodore's bailiwick; I am about to suggest that we close the dock to non-members during the day every Saturday and Sunday. There would be an exception for periods when



higher than usual traffic would be overly burdensome to the transients (usually September and October when so many boats are headed to Mexico). As with all dock usage, the Port Captain would be in control. There would probably be a small financial impact due to loss of revenue from transients. I believe that this could be mitigated by increasing the transient dock fee by a dollar per night (\$5 might make more sense). The lack of dock space has nearly reached crisis level. There are a number of unhappy boat owners that feel that it is all but impossible to get to the dock, especially on weekends. David Prewett is chairing a committee to look into dock usage solutions and, as a partial solution, the Ocean Racing Fleet has volunteered to experiment with nonracing boats on the dock during ocean races. I would really like to hear from as many of you as possible to get your feelings.

The racing was very close! Elizabeth Soll won the first race with Shannon McClish, then Rory McClish close behind. Rylie Fee was sailing in the "Green Fleet" but was right with them, Tristan Brown and Joe Rapucci handled their boats well in the windy conditions and came in that order. # FROM YOUR REAR COMMODORE



Well here it is October all ready: this year is going by too fast. Races coming up this month for the Ocean Fleet are the Fall 1 on 10/12 and for the Bay fleet the Lido Districts 10/4-5, Ladies Day 10/11 and the Wysocki Memorial 10/18-19. We are plan-

ning to have the Wysocki Memorial at Santa Margarita Lake this year. Important information about boating on Santa Margarita Lake is that to protect from potential infestation by quagga and zebra mussels park staff will perform visual inspections on every boat and if any are found to have water in the bilge or live well, or are not clean, they will not be allowed to launch.

Remember to prepare your boat by having it clean and dry for inspection.

What is clean and dry?

- Drain plugs pulled, no water in bilge, live well or • integral coolers.
- No mud, debris, aquatic weed or algae on hull, trailer or motor.

Lower units on boats should be dry-when lowered they should not contain water. This is what it says on the web site, maybe they mean center boards or some part of a power boat I am not aware of.
