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FROM YOUR COMMODORE-Wayne Ratliff

Hello sailors,

One last reminder for the *General Meeting* on November 7. The two big items are the election of next year's officers and the presentation/vote on Elevator/Vertical Platform Lift. I've taken to calling it a Motorized Personal Altitude Transportation Device. One of the ballots is for a dues increase to be wholly put into a designated reserve fund for elevator/lift construction and thereafter for operations. The increase recommended by the Board is \$\$\$ per regular membership per year.



That comes to somewhere under \$\$\$\$\$ per year. You all need to be fully aware that it will take a number of years at this rate to fund either of the presently envisioned options. We have several donations already and should be actively seeking more to augment this fund. Other Yacht Clubs have used various fundraisers to get enough money to build elevators. In the event that a future Board or general membership votes abandon the elevator project, all donations will be returned to the donors. We are all in the debt of *John Michener* and *Greg Barker* for a massive effort in preparing for the General Meeting. I hate to think of how many hours they have spent. In the past few years *Dana McClish* and *John Schmidt* have also spent a huge number of hours researching and preparing.

The club events of October 11 happened without the "train crash" foretold by *Kevin Williams*. On that day we held a *Junior Regatta*, a *Bay Cruise*, and the annual *Lady-at-the-Helm* ocean race. It took a little more dock management than usual but all events took place with minimal inter-disturbance. I was the PRO for the Ocean race. It all went well except for two glaring mistakes on the race instructions, but the racers solved the problems on the water. The corrected race times surely set a new MBYC record. The three boats finished in a 35 second window!

By the time you get this issue of the Masthead, all the Baja Haha boats will have passed through. I have enjoyed talking to the crews and vicariously been part of

the Haha. This year's Haha crews were very easy to work with and really grateful for the club's facilities.

Both Bay and Ocean Fleets had their events for women skippers this month. The Bay Fleet's Ladies Day had an enthusiastic fleet. According to *Commodore Wayne Ratliff*, who served as pro, the Ocean Fleet's Lady at the Helm race must be the closest three-boat ocean race in MBYC history, with no more than 35 seconds separating all three boats on corrected time. This year's Two-Sticker was an exercise in navigation through dense fog. A fleet of Daysailers fought light winds and a strong ebb tide to put on a show for visitors to the Harbor Festival. The Bay Fleet's Fall 2 had winds so light that boats had to get towed back in after completing one race. The top finishers in these races are tabulated below:

THE FOURTH ANNUAL MBYC JUNIOR REGATTA ... by Kit Lockwood

Nineteen of the Yacht Club's Junior Sailors raced on October 11th in the Junior Regatta.

It was a beautiful sailing day. By 9 am the dock, the deck, and boatyards, had kids, volunteers, Lido coaches, ocean sailors, sails and equipment everywhere. Just like a Yacht Club should be.

Let me tell you about the regatta...There were 4 Classes racing: 3 LASERS, 6 LIDOS, 3 OPTIMIST CHAMPION-SHIP FLEET, and 7 OPTIMIST GREEN FLEET (newer, less experienced sailors). The racing was close and exciting in all the classes.

In the LASER Class, after 3 races there was only 1 point between each boat. *Joe Repucci* was racing in the Laser for the first time, and he made *Rylie Fee* and *Jenna Duberg* pay close attention to their sailing. *Rylie* made a smart move and was able to switch to a bigger sail after the first race, thanks to a loan from *Jenna*. She then proceeded to take a first place in Lasers.

In the LIDO Class the junior drives the boat and has a coach as crew, except for *Keiran Hansen*, who wanted to have a friend race with him and was lucky enough to have *Bob Kizziar* loan his boat to him. It was the first time *Keiran* had sailed a Lido, and by the last race he had it wired and took a first. For *Ian MacDonald*, *Olivia MacDonald*, and *Ben Gaines*, it was their first regatta, and a challenge for their coaches, and a great learning experience for them. The first and second place finishers were an even tie score after the first 2 races, and only one point apart at the end of the day with *Abigail Ogle* w/*Ron Giddings* just squeaking by new sailor and racer *Sierra Frank* w/*Pat Rygh*. The juniors are very lucky, and thankful, to have dedicated coaches: *Bryan Watson*, *Larry Salas*, *Lex Budge*, and *Ron* and *Pat*.

The Opti Sailors begged for "at least 2 more races, not just one more", and we obliged. The Deed of Gift calls for 3 races, and try to get 5 races in.

The OPTIMIST Green Fleet was the largest, and had some of the youngest sailors. They were often challenged by the light and shifty wind, and the tidal flow was light but still could present a problem to young sailors. Also, rounding marks with bigger Lido's and Lasers in close proximity could be daunting (though the RC made every effort to avoid that). *JT Krossa* finished with four bullets, *Andrew Monroe* next with all 2nds, and *Audrey McClish* with all 3rds. It was the first regatta for *Madeline Ogle*, *Anna Stenger*, *Claire Stenger*, and *Ethan Carroll*, and they did a fine job getting to the finish line.

These sailors have been going to "away regattas" competing in San Francisco, Santa Cruz, Newport, Cabrillo Beach, and Santa Barbara. *Rory* went to Nationals with over 100 boats to compete against. This added experience really showed on race day. When I mentioned this to *Rory*, he commented that what really helped him in this regatta was that he'd been working on his roll tacks a lot, which really helped him in light air. *Shannon* and *Elizabeth* finished in a dead tie and the racing between them was exciting to watch.

THEY ARE ALL WINNERS for getting out there and doing their best, being good sports, helping each other, and having a good time sailing.

THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU ... to ALL OF YOU who came to us and said you wanted to help. It

took a whole bunch of Day Sailors, Lido Sailors, Laser Sailors, and Parents, who were happy to do whatever was needed. Race committee, dock facilitators, safety boats, lunch and float crews. The ocean racers who all seemed happy to share the dock with us. I can't begin to name and thank you individually...I'd be sure to overlook someone, and the long list would get boring. You know who you are and so do we.

I do have to name the 5 dedicated sailors who work with the juniors often and all the time, making the program what it is today. Advisor, *Angela Soll*, who keeps it all organized and makes it fun. Coaches: *Dana McClish*, *Lex Budge*, & *Ron Giddings*.



Two Sticker

The good crew of the Guayacan sailed out into the fog to compete in the Two Sticker. Our skipper, Lynn Meissen, and crew Gay Cantwell, Howard Grisham and Rich Olney sailed the Guayacan to second place. We did not have the foggiest idea where we were but with the aid of GPS we found the MBYC marker and laid a course for Constantine. Visibility was so low that we had to make several attempts at the GPS coordinates for Constantine before we found the mark at 4:08 PM thanks to assistance from **Howard's** \$2.99 iPhone navigation application. Now, that was a well spent three bucks! Our Skipper noted our time at the mark, we also noted that the Constantine buoy was not "exactly" at its coordinates but it was so foggy that even a very small inaccuracy in our gear made finding the mark very difficult. Even with our GPS we had basically stumbled onto the mark. We made a course for Morro Bay. When we arrived at the bay entrance, visibility was less than 50 yards. We posted lookouts, strained our eyes and tuned our ears for the harbor entrance buoys. We took all sail down outside the bay and motored on quietly, with just enough turns on our prop to give headway. Slowly, slowly we approached the sound of surf our ears could hear but our eyes could not see. Trusting GPS and wishing we had radar, finally, thankfully, the north break water buoy was sited very close to our starboard bow. The suspense really builds when your instruments tell you that you have arrived but you cannot verify the fact with your eyes. Then we were all pointing and shouting at the ghost of the green entrance buoy as it materialized out of the fog. With the green buoy in sight and correctly on our port bow the red entrance buoy made a brief, fuzzy appearance and we crept into the bay in near zero visibility finding the sand spit close on our starboard bow, eight feet of water. A slow turn to port found some automobile headlights peeking through the fog on the Morro Rock road and then we found the channel. Gradually, the 4 and then the 8 buoys came into view. As they did the Coast Guard Cutter met us, hailing that they were responding to a call from MBYC that MBYC had not been able to contact Guayacan on channel 16 or 9 even though we were listening for them. Assured that we knew our way home, the Coast Guard returned to their dock. We were warmly greeted at the MBYC dock. Peter **Behman** and **Lynn Meissen** spoke and from what I overheard, our foggy entry to the bay has to be one that will be remembered a long time. *Peter* reported that the fog was so thick at Constantine when he arrived at the proper latitude and longitude he could not find it even with the aid of radar. That made it even more amazing that we had found Constantine at all. Our crew will speak with great reverence and respect for Lynn's sailing skills in the future. We didn't have the foggiest idea where we were but the Guayacan has a nose for home. We had a guest crew person aboard the Guayacan, Richard Olney from San Jose, visiting his cousin Sandy Grisham. Rich was an awesomely game sailor and Lynn awarded him the second place MBYC mug at the award presentations. The crew of the Guayacan enjoyed the hospitality of the Cruising Fleet and their very tasty chicken barbeque. Congratulations to the HO' OLUANA and crew for their win. — Howard Grisham
