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FROM YOUR COMMODORE-Wayne Ratliff

Hello sailors,

Summer sailing has begun. The first week of classes had to be rescheduled due to under-enrollment. It's probably a sign of the economic times. But the first weekend class became somewhat oversubscribed when two walk-ins enrolled. Putting up those flyers outside may have done the trick.



The hoist modification is complete. Now the hoist can be reconfigured to lift twice the weight that it used to be capable of. (There, I just used a preposition to end a sentence with). At **Bob Kile's** and the

Morro Bay Harbor Office's advice, we hired a crane inspector to certify the hoist. An agent of *All-Cal* came out and used his truck as a test weight. He attached a scale onto the hoist hook and then strapped his truck to the scale and lifted to 25% beyond the rating, 1000 lbs in our case, and waited 10 minutes to see if the hoist clutch would keep holding, which it did. He asked me for the model number of our hoist and I told him it was a custom built hoist, but he needed a model no. So I told him it was a "*Kile-001*". I showed him the method of doubling the capacity, but since the cable loading is halved, he passed the new system without additional testing.

During the hoist work, we needed to get several cable nico-press swages done. I used to get this done at *Cuesta Equipment*, but they are no more. Next I tried *Miner's Ace* who did the swages for free, but didn't have the proper tool for passing inspection. *Larry Earl* then found out that *Jerry's Marine & Tackle* in Morro Bay had the right tool. *Jerry* then did 4 sets of swages for free. Jerry is now our only "chandlery" in Morro Bay.

Maralee Parkin tells me that she needs volunteers to help out with the *Tidelands Park* cleanup. Club members help out on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Contact Maralee if you want to get out for a walk in the park (carrying a bag and tongs).

You may have noticed that the dredge *Yaquina* is back. They will be working on the harbor entrance and Sand Trap areas until July 10-15. I understand that the inner harbor will be dredged in the fall in a separate operation. That will certainly give bay racing a new and exciting complication, as if all the moored boats weren't enough.

In response to *Port Captain Williams* request for clarification on the definition of "*use*" with respect to the mooring and yard policy letters, the Board decided that living aboard a moored boat does not, in and of itself, qualify for "*use*". Further clarification of "*use*" will be a topic of the July Board meeting.

Finally, the Board Meeting for July will be on July 2nd instead of the usual 2nd Thursday due to the *Huntington High Sierra Regatta*.






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Morro Bay Yacht Club Has a Big Race Weekend

Participant report by Howard Grisham

Great sailing weather *Memorial Day* weekend. The *Day Sailer Fleet 128 Championships* were held in the south bay, a windward/leeward course on a west wind near the 17 mark in the bay. Turn out was awesome, fourteen Day Sailers participating in an appropriately *"Indianapolis 500"* format. *Wayne Ratliff's Voyager II* served as committee boat and the northerly starting pin.


In race one, my main sail outhaul came undone soon after the start, a new idea for my outhaul wasn't all that good. The predictable loss of sail power made for frustrating up wind

legs but a full, spinnaker like main on the down wind run. We performed the function of back marker, finishing 12. Returning the outhaul to its former configuration greatly improved our experience. All starts were exciting, unbridled enthusiasm resulting in a general recall in race two. On the restart we crossed the line just under the stern of *Voyager* and beat up wind in fourth place behind *Kevin Williams, Dan McDonald* and *Tom Tidyman*. Seven laps later on the final beat to the finish, *Michael Measures* inched up to beat our boat by the smallest millimeter of margins. We finished in fifth place, best ever for *Snap* and proving that even a blind squirrel finds a nut now and then. The windward mark proved to be an adrenalin rush when closely placed boats rounded on port and returned down wind on starboard. As a later arriving boat at the mark on port tack there were some quick decisions to make. On port, it was go ahead or astern and don't make a mistake because the Day Sailers were making great speed in both directions. My first time crew, *Larry Earl*, performed his tasks smartly while I made mistakes that slowed our boat on tacking and rounding marks, ending the morning session 11th and 13th. The windward/leeward course was short compared to the usual race courses. I really enjoyed the close racing, never out of touch with other boats. It's fun because the only boat that matters is the one directly ahead or behind and in this style of racing that is all the time. The saying goes that when ever there are two sailboats going in the same direction, that is a race, and that certainly held true on Sunday.

The fleet returned to *MBYC* for lunch break to discuss the morning's events. There were many animated conversations on tactics, the exclamation points, fickle winds and "oops sorry about that" things that occur in every race. On returning to the marks for the afternoon set of races *Snap* "snapped" its boom vang on the afternoon's increasing winds and we had to retire. We returned to the boat hoist to lift a broken *Snap* out of the water, but no such lift was needed for crew, *Larry* and I had a glorious time. Being able to say we were right there with the leaders in a race will give my grin muscles a good workout for some time to come.

I appreciate that sailors more skillful than I are quick to share their knowledge and help with the set up of all the boats in the fleet. Race committees are all about ensuring the enjoyment and safety of all participants in our sport. The awards ceremony is a celebration of everyone that make it work. It is a good environment for an old pollywog like myself. My only regret is that I did not start sailing sooner. Come and sail with us, it is a beautiful thing to do.
