MEMBERSHIP


Congratulations to Forrest and Frances Martin for having attained Life membership status; they have been members for 26 years and we're looking forward to their participation for many more.

PORT CAPTAIN

As you know when someone gets a new job, he is eager to make a difference, to fix the things he noticed from outside, to correct the errors from years before, well, meet the new Port Captain. I hope for these same things and we will see how close I can come to my goals. With the very distinct talents and cooperation of my predecessor I think I have a better chance to reach my goals than most.

Goal One is to have an accurate record and up to date documentation of the boats on our property. The current list is rife with errors and to correct these errors I need cooperation—from all who have a boat stored on club property. A new rental agreement with accurate CF numbers, boat descriptions and owner names is a start. We should also have a new agreement for each boat stored on club property, ie., storage yard, kayak rack, dinghy dock (even if it is not billable) and mooring. Please review your obligations as stated on your rental agreement. Visible identification is required on the dinghys and it would be most helpful if the boat covers in the storage yard were also marked with name or CF numbers.

The rental agreements can be downloaded and emailed to me, or I will have them at Happy Hour. They will be available on the table at the front door with a box below to return the completed form. If none of these options are convenient, leave a message at 805-772-3981 ext 1, so we can talk about it..

Secondly, the Board approved a few changes in the Dock Use Policy Letter No 6 which apply to the big boats. I recommend that you review the revised policy letter if this affects you.

All boats, <u>member and non-member</u>, shall register in the club's sign-in log. (Please sign in even for day use only.)

Dock Fees:

The Board of Directors sets dock fees based on <u>Length Over All</u>, which means that Dock Charges for members will be billed at the member rate based on <u>LENGTH OVER ALL</u> including bowsprits, davits, dinghys, ladders and anchors. This has been the standard for Transients, and the industry standard for as long as I have been sailing, but has been unclear for members.

Members are permitted two over night stays per month at no cost to the member. Member time on the dock in excess of those two days shall be charged at the rate set by the Board. (The special rate is posted at the registration desk.)

Guest boats with a member aboard will be charged at guest rates.
