Zinfandel

Now that *Burger Wednesdays* have resumed, you are no doubt wondering "What wine goes best with my hamburger?" That's easy, Zinfandel! Zin is also the quintessential California wine, accounting for 10% of California vineyard acreage and was once considered "America's vine and wine." The origin of this robust peppery delight and how it arrived in California has, until recently, been a bit of a mystery. Enter science. In 1993 UCD Professor Carole Meredith, with the support of the Zinfandel Advocates and Producers (ZAP), used DNA finger-printing to nail Zin as the ancient Croatian grape, Crljenak Kaštelanski. There is

some marketing and European Union labeling law nonsense that Zin is really

Primitivo, an Italian grape from the Pulga region. Don't be fooled, Primitivo is really Zin's little Italian nephew, not Zin Itself. How Zin got to California is murkier. While there is some evidence that Zin arrived on the other coast (east) as early as 1829, my money is on "Count" Agoston Haraszthy, the "Father of California Wines." This colorful character, some say a scoundrel, who brought a variety of European vines to Cali-



fornia in 1861, deserves a separate note. Did Zin make it to Paso? You bet. Turley Vineyards includes the Ueberroth Vineyard, planted in 1885, which is the oldest vineyard in the Paso Robles appellation. The Dusi Vineyards (Dante & Benito), first planted in 1923, also produces excellent Zin which can be found in Tobin James, Peachey Canyon, Steven Ross, Ridge and of course J Dusi Wines.

I will be hosting a special Zinfandel tasting on Friday, July 12. See you there.
