Monday the 18th at 10:00. Be there or be square, **G.P.P.** P.S. wear your camos



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
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### <u>HAPPY HOUR HOSTS</u>






### Wine and Food

Whites with White Meats? Mostly, but It's Really the **Chemistry** 

With the Holiday Season approaching, this month's tasting note is devoted to pairing wine and food. While "red wines with red meats & white wine with



white meats" is a pretty good rule of thumb, wine color really has nothing to do directly with food pairing. To understand why, let's dissect the taste of wine. Our taste buds can sense four basic tastes; sweet, sour, bitter and salty (I'm ignoring the controversial fifth taste, umami or glutamate). Wine contains three of the four tastes, sweet, sour, and bitter. Wine also has alcohol (ethanol) which has little taste, but has several indirect effects as we shall see shortly. What in wine produces these tastes? Residual sugar makes a wine sweet, acidity makes a wine taste sour, and tannins (flavonoid phenols) makes a wine taste bitter. Ethanol enhances the bitterness of tannins. Now consider foods. We tend to prefer oppositely paired tastes. Tanning bitterness directly opposes red meat fats and ethanol enhances these tannins. Because red wines are fermented on the red skins, they tend to be high in tannin and alcohol; hence "red wines with red meats." White wines are not left on the skins (all grape juice is white), thus they are less tannin. White meats, fish, chicken, etc., are lower in fats; hence "white wine with white meats." Acidity and residual sugar play similar roles. They pair best with foods and sauces with opposed tastes. So now you know the real secret of wine and food pairing and you can throw out all those confusing charts constructed by the chemically challenged. The next time you have a fatty white meat, e.g., salmon, try a Pinot Noir instead of a Chardonnay.

A few races were held and tactics were discussed between each race. Then after lunch on the water the sailors headed over to the sand spit, where they proceeded to roll down the dunes. I suggested summersaults but one young sailor yelled "Flips!" Yikes! Before I could say anything he executed a perfect flip off the top of a dune. Afterwards the sailors cleaned out the Whaler and then to clean themselves of all that sand managed to fall off the dock or get tossed off by their dads.

By the time you are reading this a contingent of sailors from Morro Bay Juniors has headed



down to Santa Barbara for the Goblin Regatta. More on that next month.
