FROM YOUR COMMODORE—Todd Hansen

Spring is here, and with it came the high winds of spring. The flags on top of the dock piles are getting a workout! With the coming of spring comes longer days and the more opportunities to enjoy the water in Morro Bay. Its also the time to enjoy a few spring rituals – like Opening Day, the April General Meeting, and Boating Safety Week.

Opening day was lovely if you missed it. The weather was perfect, the decorations were breathtaking, and the program followed the traditions of our club, short and to the point, followed by some great sailing this year. If you attended the program, then you know the Commodore almost lost his composure at the dais. The combination of



the wonderful music by Paul VanderPol on the bag pipes and Paul Irving on the trumpet, and a heart full of thanks for all the volunteers that put together to day got me choked up.

At the April General Meeting, we took another step closer to getting a photovoltaic system installed at the club. A brief summary, the roof of the club is ideally oriented and constructed to support a solar array. If all our utility costs remain as they are today, the system would pay for itself in eight years, but as utility costs are not expected to remain constant, the actual payback period should be somewhat less. The budget committee was able to fund our typical reserves and set aside funds to pay for the system without dipping into any reserves. Ron Giddings is putting together a technical committee to help him sort through the proposals we have, and make the best choices for the club. If you would like to contribute to this effort, please contact Ron. I'm very excited to have the club virtually eliminate our costs for electricity going forward.

The club will be hosting Boating Safety Week again this year on our dock and on the tarmac. This year we will have the United States Coast Guard, the Morro Bay Harbor Patrol, the California Department of Fish and Game, and the San Luis Obispo Sheriff's Department on the dock offering tours of their vessels to the public. The Coast Guard Auxiliary is organizing the event which will include a coloring contest for kids. If you never have seen the inside of the Coast Guard's motor life boats this will be your chance without having to be picked up at sea.

Summer is just around the corner. Summer sailing classes are already forming. If you know someone that wants to learn to sail have them contact Glenda Boatman at gboatmanmb@gmail.com to reserve a spot in a class.

A quick reminder regarding bringing alcohol into the club for special occasions. The month of May will see some long planned projects finally getting completed. The deck piling work is scheduled mid-May during favorable tides and the long awaited outside stair replacement should also be completed. This will allow the chair lift to be installed. Thanks to Dana McClish and Todd Hansen who have worked diligently on both of these projects.

Bob Neumann, retired Fire Chief for San Luis Obispo, has purchase the automated external defibrillator for the Club and will be installing it on the wall near the fire place. There will be a training session for Club members to not only help familiarize them with the unit but mostly give you the confidence to use it. As Bob noted the unit's directions goes through all the steps but getting people comfortable with taking it out of case, and using it is the challenge.

The safety boat's cooling system has been thoroughly gone through and is now working really well; apparently there was some sea life growing in the passageways. Also the hoist cable was replaced. A big thank you to Dave Hensinger for taking care of both items.



Speaking of Bobs, Bob Walker is investigating the best way to replace the chain link fence at the storage yard. He's going to get some bids from a couple of fence installation companies to see what the prices are and then we'll have to decide if the Club wants to pay to have it done or put in some sweat equity. The fence was put in by the members, but putting in a virgin fence is a bit easier than having to dig out all the old posts and the accompanying concrete.

Looking at other more labor intensive projects, I would like to try and get some folks together that would like to help out with some painting projects. The upper deck needs to be painted as well as a couple of the walls upstairs and downstairs. The yardarm also needs painting and some new halyards. I'm of the opinion a tall ladder for the yardarm seems be a lot easier project than the description I've been given on unbolting it and lowering it down. Although that might make a good YouTube video.

Ron Giddings presented a preliminary review of installing solar cells on the roof at the recent General Meeting and will be moving forward with the help of a committee to further look into the estimated costs and savings over the expected life of the project.

Lastly, as always, the FOB system is still creating problems despite Todd Hansen installing the newest software version- just as I learned the old software, and Ken Twist installing and uninstalling drivers, changing comm ports, baud rates, etc. etc. Maybe it's time for an upgrade.

Boats Needed to Host Big Brothers Big Sisters May 14th —The yacht club will host Big Brothers Big Sisters on Saturday May 14th. March Still Racing—Since the Masthead was put to bed before the running of Spring I on March 26 here it is. The Saturday before Easter the distilled essence of the bay fleet (four boats) raced in near perfect conditions. Simon Graves and his girls Marina and Charlotte and their friend Antonio (all MBYC Juniors) helped out on deck and on the safety boat with Chuck Losness and Katie Crawford.

Moderate winds from the North-West were present at all the starts. The entire fleet seemed rusty and although all boats were clear nobody had

a very good start in the first race. Carlton Smith was first to the weather mark and then there was a long spinnaker run back to E where the fleet fell into a trap. The flooding tide and fluky winds that far back in the bay had racers going backward after "rounding" the mark. Beach Party (Deborah and Carlton) escaped before the worst calm descended. Good Grief (Joe Fram and Greg Barker), Artful Dodger (Bob Smirl and Lee Piatek) and Zopilote (Nathan and Dave Hensinger) were left sailing backwards. Nathan in Zopilote resorted to tacking back to the sandspit and sailing up current before reaching back to the mark with enough momentum to round. The success of this maneuver encouraged his immediate return to the sandspit where along with Good Grief he was becalmed while Artful Dodger pulled ahead to finish behind Beach Party, followed by Zopilote and Good Grief.

The second and third races had mostly clean starts and lots of short tacking along the spit to avoid the current. Finishing order for both: "Beach Party", "Zopilote", "Good Grief", "Artful Dodger". Overall points "Beach Party" 3, "Zopilote" 7,

"Artful Dodger" 10, "Good Grief" 10. With "Artful Dodger" third overall based on second place finish in race 1.

April, Even More Racing— April racing started off with the Laser Slalom on April 2nd. With the blessing of Chris Surfleet the Jr. Advisor, two junior program Lasers were rigged and shared for the day's racing. A field of 4 (Brett Cross, Ollie Kuntz, Andrew Brown, and Kevin Williams) took turns racing and officiating. In the first pair of races, Andrew Brown bested Ollie Kuntz, and Brett beat a capsized Kevin Williams. In the final, Andrew Brown schooled our Vice Commodore Brett Cross.

The **Ocean Fleet Spring I** held on April 3rd as recounted by ocean fleet captain Ken Muther, "Seven boats entered the 10.7-mile race and all seven finished. The Bermuda Start was at 12:30 but the wind for the first 40 minutes was light and variable so the early advantage went to the boats that got some extra puffs. Evening

Tide barely passed the 18EB buoy in time to avoid the bailout but then began to find a little wind and briefly led. Soon Kiskedee passed to take the lead and was the first to round the mark at Mouse Rock, closely followed by Synergy and Pangaea. Fiorghra was five minutes back with Evening Tide and Savage Lady both reaching Mouse Rock together and five minutes behind Fiorghra. The wind had finally arrived and all boats made good speed on the next leg to MBYC buoy. Kiskedee continued to lead with Pangaea and Synergy side by side and two minutes behind. On the final leg to the finish Kiskedee fell behind and Pangaea was the winner with Synergy one minute back. Fiorghra was ten minutes back and beat Savage Lady by five seconds. Evening Tide and Jessie Marie were an additional ten minutes back. "

The **Opening Day Race for the ocean fleet** on Saturday April 9th had two contestants. Werner Weinstock's Pangaea, and Ken Muther's Eveningtide. In very light conditions the fleet required two hours to cover roughly two miles. The race was called at the first mark with Pangaea collecting the win.

The next day Sunday April 10th the **Bay Fleet Opening Day** races were held. The bay fleet had invigorating sailing conditions with 8-12 knots of wind from the W/NW and a moderate flood tide which went slack by the third race. The fleet of eight boats began racing promptly sometime after the last boat was rigged. The first race was Cs, 10 A F and provided a good deal of foreshadowing. Carlton Smith and Deborah in *Beach Party* took the gun ahead of Commodore Todd and Joyce Hansen in True Blue followed by Dana McClish and Teresa in Sundance. The second race promised to mix things up. The course was around C then back to 17 and then up to finish. Sundance were leading after C, 17, and E but mistakenly turned back to 17 and set their spinnaker when they should have proceeded to finish. The rest of the fleet courteously eventually informed them of their navigational error but it was too late to prevent them from taking DFL. Beach Party again took the gun in race 2 followed by True Blue and then Nathan Hensinger and Joel Surfleet in Zopilote. Going into the third race Beach Party had 2, True Blue 4, Zopilote 7, and Sundance 10. The last race was run for the benefit of the Race Committee 3x around C E and 14 so cowbells could be rung. At the start, Zopilote tangled with the dock. True Blue was off to an early lead with Beach Party and Sundance in pursuit. True Blue held the lead until at least the second rounding of C from which point the results of the first race were largely repeated. Final results were *Beach Party 3*, *True Blue 6*, *Sundance 13*, *Zopilote 14* on a tie-breaker with Justin Bradshaw in Amorcita 14, Chris Surfleet in Solar Coaster 17, Stanley Craig in Piraat 18, and Audrey McClish and Andrew Monroe in *Protest!* 23. Thanks to Safety boat Brett Cross and David Patrick (who just wandered in off the street), and deck help: Dawn and Joe Huntsinger, Rich Leamon, and Bill Albrecht.

Recounted by fleet captain Ken Muther, "The Ocean Fleet Winter III makeup race (6.9 miles) was held on April 17th. Light wind was expected but there was just enough wind for the boats to move. On the first leg to 18EB there was an unexpected headwind and Whizbang just made it in time to avoid the bailout which would have shortened the race. We beam-reached slowly back to the MB buoy and then headed west toward the MBYC buoy, two miles offshore. The wind had shifted making this another upwind leg. Whizbang had a considerable lead but Pangaea, Evening Tide and Fiorghra were still fairly close to each other. Jessie Marie found the wind too light to make much progress and chose to quit. Evening Tide chased Pangaea to the finish line, finishing 11 minutes behind (Whizbang was 25 minutes ahead of Pangaea). The wind died before Fiorghra could reach the finish and they motored in for a DNF.

This completed the Winter Series with first place going to Werner Weinstock (Pangaea), second to Tony Gomez (High 5) and third to Rich Steuk (Synergy). Also taking part in the series were Guayacan,

Evening Tide, Whizbang, Jessie Marie, Savage Lady and Fiorghra.

The **Bay Fleet's Spring II** was held on April 16th. Carlton Smith and Deborah Paes De Barros put on an excellent race. The fleet consisted of six boats: Rebel Banana, Super Weener, True Blue, Happy Trails, O'Tay, and Zopilote. The first race started with a moderate ebbing tide and 7-9 knot winds from the north. The course was two loops around Cs, 10, A, 10, A, F. The Hansen's in True Blue were leading Greg Miller in O'Tay at the last windward mark. After that rounding, they headed deep into the channel against the ebbing tide and took most of the fleet with them. The Hensinger's in Zopilote hugged the spit and held off O'Tay to take first. The second race finished with O'Tay in first, True Blue in second, and Rebel Banana in third. Going into the third race O'Tay was two points ahead of both True Blue and Zopilote. The start of the last race saw O'Tay over early and the rest of the fleet salivating over the prospect of a chance at winning the day. Greg credits a monster lift, but excellent sailing must have come into play, because O'Tay was back in the lead by the wind

ward mark. The race finished with two loops around 17 and D. By this time the tide was slowing but the wind was also becoming inconstant. After the last leeward mark rounding the leaders headed straight up the channel appearing to be able to almost lay the finish. Unknown to the rest of the fleet O'Tay had damaged its centerboard rounding 17 and was crippled to windward. Nathan Hensinger crewing in Zopilote noticed that the boats ahead (O'tay and Rebel Banana) were not making way and beat his reluctant skipper into heading to the sand spit. The race finished with Rebel Banana just ahead of Zopilote then Super Weiner, True Blue, and O'Tay. Finial for the day: Zopilote 7, O'Tay 8, Rebel Banana 8, True Blue 9, Super Weiner 13, and Happy Trails 18.

The **Ocean Fleet's Spring II** was raced on Sunday, April 24th. The conditions were harsh. The two triangular flags of a gale warning were flying from the Coast Guard's masthead. Cold winds over 20knots and 8-12 foot seas with a short period made for an uncomfortable ride. Three boats set out, Evening Tide, Savage Lady II, and Pangaea. Pangaea was first back to the dock retiring short of the finish after a headsail began to fail. Savage Lady II was the first to finish for the win and a bottle of champagne. Evening Tide took second and the bottle of Cabernet.

Maybe Upcoming Racing—The Ocean fleet contests Ocean III on the 15th of May and the Two Sticker on the 22nd of May. The bay fleet racing in May is concentrated on Memorial Day weekend with the Daysailer Fleet Champs on the 28th. Laser/Lido Fleet Champs on the 29th, and the Jack Johnson on the 30th.
