

For Spring Series Results: Carlton Smith and Brett Cross in Beach Party winning both Spring I and Spring II, and second in Spring II, had a total of 15 points for first place. Simon Graves and Bob

Walker in Ramona, Proing Spring I, and placing third in Spring II, and second in Spring III had a total of 22 points, for second place honors. David Hensinger and Nathan Hensinger/Mo McEwen in Zopilote, with a total of 33 points placed third.

Next on the agenda on June 10, was our **Daysailer Summer I** race. The day started with wind predictions of over twenty five knots by the afternoon, so Bob Schwenoha, the Race Pro, decided to do quick three races with no breaks. The first two races went off without a hitch for **Simon Graves** and **Bob Walker** in Ramona, taking two first place finishes, and **Carlton Smith** and **Tom**

Murphy in Beach Party, taking two second place finishes. But by the third race, the winds had picked up dramatically, and with the fleet heading to the first mark, Simon and Bob in Ramona, got backwinded in their sails which caused their boat to flip over into the water. Katy Crawford and Chuck in the safety boat were able to help them right their boat, then tow them to the dock, where they proceeded the task of removing the water from their boat. By the end of the third race the bay had totally white caped out, and the fleet was struggling to get their sails down.





Final results: first place, Carlton Smith and Tom Murphy with 7 points second place, Simon Graves and Bob Walker with 9 points, and third place, Todd Hansen and Joyce Hansen with 9 points.

Ocean Fleet Captain—Ken Muther

The Ocean Fleet Spring Series races were completed on June 4th. The first race on April 23rd was a high-wind event. The forecast was NW20-25 gusting 35 with waves of 7 to 9 feet. Should we cancel? Naw! It's my job to run races, not cancel them! The course was moved closer to shore where

the wind might be lighter. Even so we saw gusts reading 30 knots but the waves were less than five feet. Big boats go fast when there is lots of wind so Guayacan won again. Even the smallest boat (that's me) finished the eleven mile course in a bit more than two hours. Guayacan first, Pangaea second and Evening Tide third.

The second race on April 30th turned out terribly. The forecast said wind of 10-20 knots but where was it? Instead of wind we had steep breaking whitecaps. In other words, terrible conditions to try to sail. Five boats entered, no one finished. The final race on June 4th was forecast to be windy and rough but the wind stayed under 20 knots and the waves were moderate. The Bermuda Start had Guayacan starting at noon with Evening Tide two minutes behind.

Whizbang's start time was 12:26 while the fastest boat (High 5) couldn't start until 12:48. The course was north to Mouse Rock Buoy (Cayucos) and back, 9.8 miles. There wasn't enough wind for Guayacan to make maximum speed which allowed Whizbang and High 5 to steadily gain on her. High 5 turned in the best performance and was closing in on Guayacan as they approached the finish but couldn't quite catch her. Guayacan first, High 5 second and Whizbang third.

With two wins Guayacan was first (8 points) in the Spring Series. Evening Tide was second with 14 points and High 5 and Pangaea tied for third with 15 points. Lynn Meissen and Guayacan will have their name on the Spring Series Trophy for the first time.

Jenkins Memorial—The Jenkins Memorial race to San Simeon was successfully completed on

Sunday, May 21st. The start line Saturday morning was at the MBYC buoy and Evening Tide was first to start at 0710. Guayacan started at 1000 and Jessie Marie at 1043. It was foggy but there was adequate wind so the boats made good progress heading across Estero Bay to Point Estero, six miles to the northwest. Of course, when beating upwind good progress does not mean fast progress. Evening Tide did get beyond the point by noon and the wind was now close to 20 knots and the waves were getting steep and difficult. There was lots of water on deck and a bit too much in the cockpit. The weather forecast had said light, variable wind in the morning and 15 knots later so the roughness was a bit of a surprise to all skippers.

At 1245 Guayacan's sail could be seen heading west and only two miles behind Evening Tide who was heading north toward Cambria. Guayacan then disappeared into a



fog bank and was not seen again until 1600. Once north of Point Estero the boats met a south-flowing current that greatly hurt upwind progress. At least the fog cleared by 1400 so one thing was going right. By this time Guayacan had quit sailing and was motoring north. Jessie Marie was also affected by the bad current but continued under sail power until 1800 when the rules allowed motoring to finish the remaining distance. All three boats were anchored at San Simeon by 1930. Jessie Marie had made the best progress while sailing and held a three hour lead over Evening Tide. Guayacan suffered a 30 minute penalty for motoring before 1800.

The next morning was sunny and nice as it usually is at San Simeon. Everyone had a restful morning and began getting ready for the start at 1100. Evening Tide started on time while the others were a little later. There was great wind just outside the bay and Jessie Marie headed offshore to look for the strongest wind. Downwind sailing is sure a joy compared to what the boats had faced on the previous day. Now we could make five knots or more in a straight line toward the finish (23 miles away). The water was also much smoother. Guayacan caught up with Evening Tide as we passed Cambria and then headed offshore to look for stronger wind (the wind had decreased).

As Evening Tide approached Point Estero the other two boats crossed ahead and sailed into fog. The wind continued to get lighter and speeds fell to below four knots. Jessie Marie and Evening Tide eventually sailed together for the last four miles but Guayacan was farther east and still hidden by fog. Large boats are always faster than small boats if there is enough wind but now the wind was a bit too light to give an advantage. Somehow Evening Tide managed to pass and finished one minute ahead of Jessie Marie. Before we finished Guayacan appeared out of the fog and finished about 20 minutes ahead of us.

Who won? Jessie Marie's good performance on the first day gave her an easy victory. After the times from both days were combined and the handicaps applied Jessie Marie's total time was 13 hours and 58 minutes. Evening Tide was next at 17 hours and 10 minutes with Guayacan only164 seconds behind. The Jenkins race had not been run since 2008. A race of this length is a greater challenge than our usual short races inside Estero Bay. To quote from the Jenkins Trophy Deed of Gift, "This race is meant to test not only the sailor's capability in producing raw speed in their yacht, but also to test the sailor's navigational, safety, and seamanship skills."

Over Memorial Day weekend junior sailors were successful participants in the Morro Bay Yacht Club Laser Championships, and the Jack Johnson race. The Laser Championship was won by Cal Poly sailor, Joe Lausten, Justin Bradshaw was second, with junior sailor Nathan Hensinger taking third. The Jack Johnson race was dominated by junior sailors with Cole Howe winning the grand prize. Lots of adults braved the cramped conditions and competed, but it did not go very well. Better luck next time!


