In Memoriam: Charter Member Stewart Reid

We offer very special words of sympathy to Myrtle Reid, Sheila, Kathleen, and David upon the death of "Stew" on June 5th, his 72nd birthday.

Shortly after moving from the Midwest to Morro Bay in the early 50s, Stew and Myrt were married. They then helped and later ran the family business, a model and the Chevron station on Morro Bay Boulevard—closed only in recent years under increasing pressure and regulation. We are sure may young people learned their work ethic there under Stew's guidance.

Marriage and work did not prevent Stew from pursuing his other love, sailing, and while cruising around the bay, he and a handful of others recognized in each other a love of the water, gathered others around them and, in 1956, formed the Morro Bay Yacht Club for all those interested in boating—young or old, rich or poor.

Always participating in community affairs, Stew was a past Master in the Estero Lodge and a very active brother in that organization, holding several offices and volunteering hundreds of hours over many years while reluctant to accept accolades for his services.

Stew remained a sailor all of his life. In the early years, it was dinghies—then for many years, the *Ariel*. Typical of his quiet ways, he

long ago gave up the hype of the sometimes vocal sport of ocean racing. In recent years, it has been his Cape Dory, *Sheila*, that he had taken frequently and

Thank you for your cooperation.



An active fleet of Morro Bay Yacht Club Lidos had their annual championships at MBYC on Sunday, May 30, 2004. Eight of the ten members sailed in great Lido winds, thanks to John Neiswanger's & Kenton Hendricks' call to the Gods for gentle and predictable winds for our fleet. The Day Sailers were out in full force to support our fleet, and John and Kenton were out at a very early hour to set up great windwardleeward marks and had a support boat with us at all times. Mitch helped John & Kenton in the start-finish boat, which they had moored down by the gas dock, so the racers could have a completely different race course. It worked out great and the Bomber crew only had to move the line once. (The intrepid Bomber crew included several other Day Sailers: Lex Budge, Frank Wood, Bill Ullum, and photographer John Taylor, taking great shots of all the activity. (Thanks for the pictures, John.)

Tom and Bette Jenkins sailed their usual races, with good starts, great roundings, and faster speed than the rest of the fleet, so they finished with 5 bullets and 5 points. Kit and Don Lockwood were in 2nd place with three 2nd-place and two 3rd-place finishes for a total of 12 points overall. Peter and Anita Rothenbuecher had two 2nd-place finishes, two 3rd and one 4th for a total of 14 points overall and were in 3rd place in the fleet. Our 4th place finishers were Liz and Larry Salas with a total of 20 points. Terry Hensley and crew in 5th, Jim Orth and Dot Rygh as crew were in 6th, Bev and Roy Gammill were in 7th, and Bryan Watson and Louisa Deal were in 8th place. (This was Louisa's first time in a regatta and she learned to handle the jib like an old pro. She and Bryan came in 6th in the 4th race and showed they were beginning to worry the fleet.)

All in all, the winds stayed steady and the fleet sailed close races. No one was ever far behind, so we ended up having all five races completed. Trophies were awarded for the top three boats. The Lido Fleet 59 MBYC Trophy was awarded to Tom and Betty Jenkins (Pictures included here show the top three winners.) After the races and trophy presentation, we had a potluck chicken dinner to celebrate our day's successful event. Thanks to all for participating and for all the support from the Bay Fleet sailors.

Ocean Fleet News

It was the best of winds, it was the worst of winds, it was a race of speed, it was a race of drifting, it was a time of exhilaration, it was a time of frustration.

That was the first race of the summer series for the ocean racers on June 6th. The weather forecast called for 25- to 35-knot winds and 10- to 13-foot mixed swells at a very short 8-second interval, more than a little daunting. In addition, the two red flags indicating a gale warning were flying as we passed the Coast Guard Station. But the conditions we saw were dramatically different.

The original course was from the entrance buoy, MB-1, to Constantine buoy, to Mouse Rock buoy, back to Constantine, then finishing back at MB-1. But, as preplanned, we shortened course to eliminate the second Constantine passing when the lead boat failed to round Mouse Rock by 2PM.

Three boats entered the race, Ron May's *Whizbang*, David Crowe and Keith Lippy's (sp?) *Second Wind*, and my *Voyager II*. The wind was light at the start but the seas were choppy enough to make sailing difficult. *Whizbang* maneuvered well and started first, just a few seconds after the "gun."

All boats headed north toward Cayucos but ran out of wind after a mile or so. *Whizbang* and *Voyager II* tacked west, toward Hawaii, in search of wind. The wind was so light that we were both having trouble keeping steerage way. For a while, we found ourselves directly in front of *Whizbang*. We could see whitecaps (and wind) just a few hundred feet off our bow, but like a carrot on a stick, we could never actually get to the good wind and were lured further and further on (although very slowly). Eventually, *Whizbang* tacked back onto a heading for

Constantine and appeared to be moving a whole lot better than we were. We weren't moving fast enough to tack through the eye of the wind and we had to 'wear the boat' to get around (*a la* the old square riggers). After that, the wind and boat speed gradually improved although we were again behind *Whizbang*. The wind got stronger and stronger all the way to Constantine. We lost sight of *Second Wind* who apparently abandoned the race at about this time. In the last half-mile, we were overpowered with the lee rail underwater but too close to the mark to make reefing worthwhile. Whizbang rounded the weather mark a few minutes ahead of Voyager. As soon as we rounded, the wind began to fade. We headed south, away from land, to try to get back into the great wind we had just a few seconds before, but to no avail. But we were in better wind than *Whizbang* and passed her. Then the wind died again. Ever so slowly, an offshore breeze filled in from Cayucos and we both used it to round Mouse Rock buoy. Inevitably, we had to sail back through the convergence zone of zero wind to get back into the northwest flow outside of Cayucos. We both got through after another agonizing period of flogging sails and broad reached with spinnakers to the finish. af + ba = 12 = 14م ا ا ...:1

SPECIAL CLUBHOUSE USE REQUEST FOR MEMBERS WHEN INVITING MORE THAN 10 GUESTS

(Rev. October 2002)

SAMPLE

The Morro Bay Yacht Club clubhouse is for the use and pleasure of all of our members. Under certain circumstances, the Board may allow individual members to use the clubhouse for personal social functions. However, since no member in good standing may be excluded by or have his/her access to the clubhouse restricted by any other member, obtaining a special use under this application does not include the right to exclude other members or their guests.

The clubhouse may be used by a member for various personal celebrations (i.e., wedding receptions, birthdays. graduations. family reunions. etc.); however, the conditions under which approval may be granted for personal social functions are restrictive. In order to be granted use of the clubhouse, the person for whom the celebration is being held must be either the member or be in his/her **direct immediate family**. **Direct immediate family** is defined as follows:

Member's parents Member's children (includes their spouses) Member's siblings (includes their spouses) Relatives having prefixes "grand" or "great grand" attached to the terms "parents" or "children"

A member may be granted an exception to the above under the following condition: The sponsoring member must show a direct connection between the proposed function and the Objective of the Club as stated in the MBYC by-laws. The clubhouse may not be reserved under this exception unless the above condition is clearly established.

Note: Social functions that are for and primarily involve only MBYC members are not subject to the above restrictions (i.e., Bay or Ocean Fleet potlucks, etc.).

General Conditions:

(1) Anytime a member wishes to invite more than 10 guests to a function, they should submit a special use of request.

(2) No member is permitted to receive any personal remuneration for the use of the clubhouse.

(3) Use of the clubhouse for business, political or religious purposes is prohibited. A member may not request the use of the club on behalf of another group he is not affiliated with.

(4) The Board will determine the amount, if any, of security and/or cleaning deposits. There is a \$50.00 fee for the use of the clubhouse, and this amount must accompany the Request form.

(5) During any function in which non-member guests are present in the clubhouse, <u>the sponsoring</u> <u>member must be present in the clubhouse during the function and is personally responsible for all damage</u> <u>and clean up</u>. Determination of damage and clean-up costs will be made by the House Committee Chairman and will be assessed against the member by Board action.

(6) The Board will not normally grant use for the clubhouse prior to MBYC's social and racing calendar for that year being established.

(7) Members intending to use the clubhouse should provide their own galley consumables (paper plates, napkins, plastic knives and forks, etc.) or make other arrangements with the Galley Steward.

(8) Normally, the only alcoholic beverages permitted to be consumed on the clubhouse premises are those purchased from the MBYC bar. Members wishing to provide their own wine/champagne for their special occasions must request approval in the use request. Only wine or champagne is permitted and a corkage fee, set by the Board, will be charged to the member. Corkage fee is presently \$2.50/750 ml.

(9) Excessive party noise, especially if the police become involved, could result in a member's privilege to use the clubhouse to be suspended or even revoked. The sponsoring member will be held personally responsible for the conduct of his/her guests. In particular, the sponsoring member must insure that non-member guests have signed the guest register and that persons under the age of 21 not be permitted in the bar area (keep them off the tile).

(10) It is the sponsoring member's responsibility to obtain club members for bartending duties, if needed; and to contact the Bar Steward two weeks prior to the event with any special requests. AT NO TIME MAY A NONMEMBER SERVE BEHIND THE BAR!

(11) The maximum number of guests attending a function must comply with the following limitations, including any members who may be present:
