

Classified Directory in Progress — Suggestions?

Greg Barker is putting together a classified directory of local (or closest) marine services, and would like to receive suggestions for the content and contact information for providers they have used.

The current plan is to provide contact information classified by the type of service, along with the names of two or three people who have used each service. References' phone numbers would not be published with the directory, and would have to be contacted using other resources (like the club's membership roster). The classified directory would include a disclaimer that the information was provided for reference and listings do not constitute the endorsement of the Morro Bay Yacht Club or the listed references. The directory would save members time in locating local resources and help the port captain respond to inquiries by visiting crews.

The preliminary list of categories includes: boat yards, chandlery and hardware, charts, clothing and foul weather gear, clubs and associations, deliveries and transportation services, divers, diesel repairs, electrical, electronics and communications, fiberglass work, fire extinguisher service, fuel, general maintenance, graphics, haul outs, heating systems, inflatable and life raft service, insurance, law enforcement, marinas, marine canvas, outboard repairs, paints and epoxies, plumbing, propellers, riggers, sail makers, sailing instruction, surveyors, and upholstery, yacht broker.

There are a few details left to work out, and your comments and suggestions would be welcomed:

- 1. What to you think about the idea of including names of a couple of people who have used each service?
- 2. Should a nominal fee like \$1 be charged or "business card" advertisements sold to cover copy expenses?
- Are there other classifications that should be included in addition to those listed above? Any that should be dropped?

Morro Bay Yacht Club invites interested sailors to participate in the 2004 Invitational Regatta. The regatta is open to all small class boats. The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2001-2004. Personal Flotation Devices: All sailors are required to wear US Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices while racing.

Lake San Antonio is in Monterey County, just north of Bradley and south of King City.

North Shore Pleyto Launch Ramp is on the north shore, off Jolon Rd, 4 ½ mi. S. of Co. Rd. G18. Pleyto Campground & Group picnic area is located just south of the launch ramp. The group picnic site has been reserved for our fleets and we will have a BBQ pit going. Bring your own meat and a dish to share for dinner on Sat. night. When checking in at the gate, tell them you are with the MBYC regatta and they will give you a discount for camping.

Entry fees and registration will be take place from 9-11 AM on Sat. Sept. 25 at the Pleyto Group Picnic area. The entry fee for both days will be \$10.00.

A Skippers meeting will be held at 11:00 P.M. at the Pleyto Registration Area.

Sailing Instructions and Course Charts will be available at the sign up table.

Races on Saturday. are scheduled to start at 1 PM and Sunday at 11 AM (conditions are usually windier in the afternoon, but we want to finish Sunday by 3PM).


This fun race had four participants. 1st went to Whizbang, 2nd to Voyager II, and 3rd to Troublemaker.

Ocean Racing - Summer #2 June 25

It was a beautiful day in the neighborhood. The 30 knot forecasted winds didn't materialize but they scarcely ever do. The 8 foot swell at 8 seconds – the same. It seems like every race report starts off this way.

The race winds were mostly about 15 knots with gusts and lulls. The fog stayed way offshore until well after the race was over, and it was fairly warm. On *Voyager II*, we had the whole regular crew aboard, with the exception of Kevin O'Day. We missed Kevin's whoops of joy as we were going through the rolling swells at the harbor entrance on the way to the start. Four boats entered, Ron May's *Whizbang*, Lynn Meissen's *Guayacan*, David Lowe and Keith's *Second Wind* (Cal 34) and *Voyager II*.

The start was exciting for us. We were a little early to the start line. It always amazes me how hard it is to go slow in a sailboat on the rare occasion that you want to. We spend all our racing energy trying to go faster and faster, but when we want to go slow, the boat has a mind of its own and runs fast even with deliberate poor trim and zig-zag helming that would break a snake's back. But we managed to not be over early. Whizbang ran down to the start line and tacked in our lee right at noon and ate our bad air. Guayacan started about 5 minutes late, apparently due to a spirited chat on the dock before the race. Lynn says they kind of forgot about starting the race for a few minutes. Second Wind started about the same time as Guayacan, but once again, they abandoned the race with little notice from the other racers. I hope they keep on trying.

No lead changes this race. The racers just kept getting further apart. We raced from the entrance buoy, past 18EB (aka 10E for the nostalgic amongst us or simply "gong" for a few) up to Constantine and back to Morro Bay for a distance of 11.2 nautical miles. We beat up to Constantine and ran back to home. Some of us set spinnakers on the run leg. On *Voyager II*, we saw 9.90 kts of boat speed once during this leg. We enjoyed a beautiful view of *Guayacan* close reaching and heeled over in a fresh breeze as we were running for the finish.

Ocean Race - Summer #3 July 25

Four boats entered the last race in the Ocean Summer series,: Ron May's *Whizbang*, Lynn Meissen's *Guayacan*, the Bruzenak's *Kinship II* and last but not least, *Voyager II*.

It was an extremely slow start. The wind died almost completely two minutes before the start. We were doing just over one knot SOG (Speed Over Ground from GPS) for the first half hour of the race. The seas were so flat, I was thinking this would be a good day for Thistles and Day Sailors, maybe even Lasers. I was afraid that the whole race was going to be agonizingly slow but the wind filled in nicely from the west.

At the start, *Whizbang* was first, followed by *Kinship*, *Voyager* and *Guayacan*. *Whizbang* built her lead to several hundred yards in the light air and we slid under *Kinship* to assume second place. But as the breeze freshened, *Voyager* closed the gap so that *Whizbang* and *Voyager II* dueled as we got closer to Constantine Buoy. *Whizbang* warded off our

attempt to pass to windward, so we had to go below and endure her bad air for several minutes. Then we both got slowed down by the kelp at the buoy. I understand that there were cries of jubilation when *Whizbang* crewmembers saw that *Voyager* hit the kelp and they shot ahead... momentarily. After a few short tacks, *Voyager* got ahead of *Whizbang* just before rounding the buoy and extended the lead on the downhill spinnaker run back to Morro Bay, We raced from the entrance buoy, past 18EB, up to Constantine and back to Morro Bay for a distance of 11.2 nautical miles.

Even the finish time correction calculation was uniquely easy.

The course was a bit short although challenging. We started at MB-1, passed 18EB to starboard, rounded a standpipe off the beach east of 18EB to port and finished at 18EB to port (through a line extending from MB-1). The "horizon job" finish reminded me of the story of the 1851 All Nation's Race with the schooner America when Queen Victoria asked "Who was second?" and got the reply "Your Majesty, there is no second".



In 1st Place was McDonald with one of our Juniors, Connor Masterson, in 2nd place was


