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

Day Sailer Fleet 128

Day Sailer Fleet 128 is in the middle of a long racing stretch, beginning with the Perry Deaton Annual Memorial Regatta, completed the LLth and L2th of September and progressing on through

the 11th and 12th of September and progressing on through the Fall 1, Wysocki, the last regional of the year at Santa Cruz, Ladies Day, and finally Fall 2. There are plenty of good opportunities for anyone hoping to participate in close, competitive fleet racing.

The last away race that the fleet attended was the Perry Deaton Memorial Regional. Three boats from Morro Bay attended this race at Redwood City. Seven races were held in two days. Races consisted of windward/leeward and triangle courses. Races were tight with 14 hard high-end ringers competing in A class and one in B class. All races were held within the turning basin of Redwood City.

On day one, windward/leeward legs were setup on a west/east axis. Four races were completed on Saturday. At the end of the day, *Student Driver* was in fourth place, *Lemon Head* in sixth, and *Running with Scissors* somewhere in the latter half of the field. That night, the Sequoia Yacht Club held a great dinner.

On day two, the Day Sailer fleet raced three races. The winds shifted around causing the windward/leeward courses to exist on a north/south axis. Three races were held on Sunday. By the end of the day, the winds had picked up

from 10 knots to the low twenties. The spinnaker ride down from the windward mark was a bit rough with one non-Fleet-128 boat capsizing in the heavy gusts. *Student Driver* spent a good deal of the reaching leg planing with her bow out of the water and the rudder a tad bit sensitive. By the end of the regatta, *Student Driver* held on to fourth place, albeit narrowly, with *Lemon Head* close by with only one point separating the two.

Fall one is now behind us as well. Fun Captain Victor Nigro PROed this first of the series. Fleet 128 saw seven boats hitting the line on this shifty, windy day. Race one was uneventful with *Lemon Head* running off to an early lead and holding it well. At the finish line *Student Driver* barely nosed in front of *Running with Scissors* after having the hourglass spinnaker run of the day. Neiswanger again held off *Running with Scissors* and *Student Driver*, taking both first places of the day. Subsequent races were canceled due to high winds. At the end of the day, Neiswanger first, Budge second, Condon third, Murphey fourth, Taylor fifth, Daily sixth, and Branch seventh.

Two races down, many races left to go. If anyone is looking for crew or would like to crew or in some way find themselves in this growing and dynamic fleet, please email me.

Ocean Racing—Fall #1—September 5

The entries for the Fall series race #1 were: Ron May's Whizbang, Mike Brooks' Pampered Princess, and Voyager II.

It's not often hot enough to sail on the ocean in a tee-shirt in Morro Bay. I saw 81 degrees at the club after the race was over, earlier it must have been 85 on shore and 70+ on the water. We saw an ocean water temp of 64 degrees outside the harbor entrance. There was a lot of whale activity just before the race and a not so pleasant red tide bloom.

We fully expected a drifter. NOAA predicted winds variable to 10 kts. Other forecasts were not so optimistic. So we decided upon a short course with even further shortening if necessary. And it was a slow race, we averaged about two knots. Fortunately, the seas were flat as a pancake. We started at MB-1, as usual, rounded 18EB and came back to MB-1, and repeated for two laps.

Although the only lead change was sometime during the first leg when Voyager got ahead of Whizbang and stayed ahead throughout the race, but there were a lot of virtual lead swaps if handicapping were to be taken into account. We would get a sizable lead over Whizbang and then she would catch up. Even on the last leg, we got to within 50 feet of each other once.

We had a lot of excitement when Candy got locked in the aft head when the door latch broke. She was really glad to get out when we disassembled the lock.

Two club member boats, Troublemaker and Windspell, apparently felt that the club rules did not apply to them as they ignored the DOCK CLOSED signs during the race. Similarly, two other club boats, BlackJack and Hilda B Sly occupied the dock during the Lady at the Helm Race. Although, on both days, this did not present a serious problem for returning racers, it has in the past started a pattern of increasing abuse and makes it difficult to deal with transients.

Ocean Race—Two Sticker / PHRF— September 12

The entries for the annual Two Sticker/PHRF race were: Ron May's Whizbang and Voyager II. Noticeably absent were any Two-Sticker boats; Voyager and Whizbang are both sloops.

It was essentially another match race between these two boats. However, racing with another closely matched boat offers tactical opportunities that are generally uncommon in PHRF racing. We all seem to measure Ocean Racing success by the number of boats participating, but maybe the intensity of engagement should be taken into account.

PRO Ron May delayed the start a half-hour waiting for wind. Then the wind rose slowly and steadily to over 28 kts. apparent, according to Jim Bruzenak who watches the displays with wide-eyed attention. This race had pre-start tactics, upwind tactics, and downwind tactics that America's Cup racers would have recognized (and I hope approved). There were a few boatfor-boat lead changes and numerous whales spouting although the growing whitecaps soon made whale watching difficult.

As usual, I enjoyed the relaxed camaraderie with my crew and the other crew(s) on the boat at the dock after the race was over almost as much as the race itself.

Hilda B. Sly Represents Morro Bay Yacht Club at the McNish Classic Regatta

Bob Kile, first mate Nikki, along with crew John and Nia Schmidt, were proud to be a part of the 27th Annual McNish Classic Yacht Race hosted by the Pacific Corinthian Yacht Club at Channel Islands Harbor. This year's race took place on August 7th.

Hilda B. Sly was among thirty plus other classic wooden yachts to race. From small wooden skiffs to grand seventy

plus foot schooners, the scene on the water was spectacular.

With the ingenious reverse start, slower boats with higher handicaps started the race first. Then larger faster yachts started towards the end of the pack. This race method helps eliminate the risk of damaging the boats at the starting line and to allow the slower boats to finish at the same time as the faster ones. The grand finale is to see all boats cross the finish line rail to rail.

Aboard *Hilda B. Sly*, everyone was having a grand time. At the start, the wind was light. But as the race progressed, the breeze filled in and along came the fog. It was a surreal sight as the fog swallowed the fleet. Then the fog would lift just enough to get a peek to see those who were ahead or who fell behind. The biggest challenge of the day was to find the mark in less than seventy-five feet of visibility. After rounding the final mark, the fog lifted, the sun came out, and Bob and John set the two spinnakers for the final downwind leg. As the finish line neared, the huge yachts thundered down on the fleet like freight trains.

The evening finished off with a delicious steak and chicken dinner. Live jazz music in the background and race stories from the day buzzed throughout the yacht club. Many old friends got caught up on old times and many new friends were made. The McNish Classic has always been a highlight of the year for classic boaters and this year was no exception.
