


The Juniors have been getting some quality time in on the water in preparation for their first race on the 24<sup>th</sup>. Good luck to all of them.



There are openings in the back yard and kayak race for storage. See Port Captain Lynn Meissen if you would like to store your boat or kayak here at the club.


The club has purchased an FJ boat. A "Name the Boat" contest has been suggested. Stay tuned for further details. Thank you Bruce Masterson.


