

Memorial Day weekend turned into a sailing marathon. On Saturday the Lido Fleet Championships were held under gray skies, and so-so winds. After 3 races were done, it was Tom and Christina who won, the Lockwoods in 2<sup>nd</sup> and Larry and Liz Salas in 3<sup>rd</sup>. John Neiswanger did a great job of being PRO and setting courses from the Boston Whaler in the south end of the bay, with Doug Gould, Frank Wood, Mike Brooks, and Glenda Boatman in the safety boat. On Sunday, the Day Sailer Fleet Championships were sailed under sunny skies and perfect wind – again down in the back part of the bay with the Ryghs and the Lockwoods running the races and Mike Brooks in the safety boat. To those on moorings: the Club asks that you send in a current insurance declaration when it is renewed. Several are outdated.


Hamburger night can use volunteers and big appetites.

### Day Sailer Fleet 128

The last month has been an exciting one for fleet 128. Here is what has transpired in the following month. The nationals committee has picked and ordered shirts, trophies, food, and much more. This is the first time that fleet 128 has hosted a nationals regatta and it should be a very memorable one. If you do not know, we are hosting the Nationals with the Fresno fleet. The DaySailer nationals will take place the week immediately after the High Sierra Regatta. If you would like to help out with any of the many duties, measuring, food, entertainment, and so on, please contact Fleet Captain Kevin Williams.

Next, the fleet champs have come and gone. Fleet champs were held in Morro Bay between channel markers 16 and 18. This location was chosen because it offers the best upwind and downwind runs. Winds were variable, 8-13 knots, the Lido fleet PROed the race, five races constituted the regatta. In the first race, Tom Murphy led for the first leg, and managed to hold onto a third with a newbie in the boat, good going Tom. Dana McClish (1525) also led several legs with Dan McDonald(4000) in close tow. In the end the new green boat, won four of five races for the win. Windward leeward courses are all about the tactics. In the end it was Protest first, Lemon Head second, The Dan Mc Donald third, the Rothenbuchers fourth, Victor and Brian fifth, and Tom Murphy sixth; In the B fleet it was Dana McClish first, and Mark Soll second. We had 12 boats show up for the regatta, a great showing by all.

Here are some details that I found important to the regatta. Get a good start in the middle left of the line, starting on starboard tack. Go out to the sand, only if you have a great lane without moored boats in your way, the big black boat was a horrible wind block. Stay left for the first third of the uphill leg, then start going back to center. The winds seemed to increase in velocity in the center going around the corner of the parking lot. Finally, pick a good lay-line so that you have not over stood and you can still take advantage of lifts heading for the mark.

Downhill is a little different. First, set the pole at the mark but wait until the wind truly shifts to behind you before you set the kite. Some people pulled the kite immediately and this was a bit disastrous on their downwind run. When the kite is finally up, square the pole and run as low as possible to avoid having to jibe. Coming off the leeward mark, cover your competition, stay between the boat that you need to beat and the finish line. If any of the foregoing seems foreign to you, please see me, or call me. Understanding the nuances around the course is the most important part of class racing.

The Clay regatta has also transpired. This is the second regatta in the regional series, Huntington is the next. Competition at Redwood city was brutally hard. Seven boats showed up, five actually competed. The spread after five races was 3 points between first and last place. This is a great venue, there is another race in Redwood city in the fall, I hope if you are interested in racing that you will join us here.

Finally Huntington and Nationals are around the corner. If you need any help setting up and more importantly, tuning the boat. Please contact me soon, and we will go over your boat ASAP.




