

Day Sailer Fleet 128

Two events were held in the last month, the High Sierra Regatta and Day Sailer Nationals. Both of these events were held at Huntington Lake in California. Fleet 128 in conjunction with fleet 31 from Fresno hosted the Day Sailer Nationals. A huge amount of thanks goes out to Brooks and Michael for doing most of the organizing, Lolo and Lex for the t shirts and tertiary help, Jim Orth and Dave Shinn, on safety boats, Andrew and Marrie for the other safety boat, Kit and Don Lockwood, Dot and Pat Rygh for PRO-ing and protest hearings (yes we had plenty), Dana McClish for trophies and tertiary work, John Neiswanger and Kenton Hendricks for tertiary help, and finally Gail and Kevin for tertiary help. The event went great, just a side note t-shirts are still available.

If you were not at Huntington Lake this year, here is a basic summary as to how it went with few exceptions. Dave Keran, Dean Iwiashi, and Phil Root would start with the pack and quickly put real-estate between themselves and the rest of the fleet; Going higher and faster than the rest.

Six races were held for nationals, each person could throw out their worst. At the end of the week Morro Bay had two in the top ten and many more in the top fifteen. One boat "Protest" led race three for most of the race, exchanging tacks with Phil Root and Dean Iwiashi, (Keran was too far behind!). Additionally, "Lemon Head" took three 6 places. All in all, Morro Bay had a strong competitive contingent at the nationals this year taking home an eight and a ninth and many additional trophies. We did have some new fleet members at HSR this year; among them Mark Soll and Angela Soll. The results of HSR went much the same way so I will save space on discussing it here.

Following is a brief summary of what went right and some changes that can be made to all Day Sailer's to make them sail better for you. On our boat we had issues with not being able to keep the boat flat. We noticed this early on and kept tuning the boat until we could keep her down. First we tensioned the rig to 345 pounds at the shrouds, and around 180 on the forestay. This helped some but narrowed the driving range too much; the "sweet spot" was too narrow and made it very difficult to keep the boat going. Tension alone would not solve the problem.

Second, we brought the base of the mast back. This increases the pretend in the mast and flattens the mail sail, with out the high tension and consequent narrow "sweet spot" unlike tension. This helped some, but we were still hiking hard to keep the boat down. Hiking out hard keeps the crew tied up and makes it hard for them to call traffic and wind shifts. More needed to be done, the rig was now only 25'2" from the stern with 2 inches of prebend, and 300 pounds of tension.

Finally, we brought the base of the mast back another inch for a total of 2 inches from its' original position (at this time unmeasured). We kept the tension at 300 pounds for a wider "sweet spot" and we brought the tip back to 25'1" to make the nose go as high as we could. This gave the boat 5 inches of prebend, and finally we could flatten the Cressy Doyle mainsail out to keep the boat going high and fast. With these settings we were able to keep up with Dave, Dean, and Phil in the third race of the regatta.

Tactically, many things changed as to how we dealt with competition. Earlier in our sailing careers, we would cover boats as soon as we were ahead, and sit on boats downhill to keep them close. However, over the years we found that this made many competitors angry with us and eager to return the favor. At this and previous nationals we decided to only sit on people in the last leg of the race or immediately prior to what may be a tight mark rounding in traffic. When you are with the leaders they will only cover you in the very last leg of the race. By keeping off of each other's air until the end you allow the breakaway group to open a gap on the rest of the fleet that is wrestling each other for clean air.

Additionally, we kept boats that were close to us in the results close to us. We stayed with them going up the same side of the lake as they were. By doing this we were able to manage our scores. Boats that sail together finish together and thus have similar scores.

We learned and changed many things at Huntington Lake this year, as I believe many people did as well. Please note that these numbers refer to one boat and may not precisely line up with yours, however the concepts are the same and will work on any Day Sailer.

Next month we have our fleet invitational, I hope everyone is open to sail at this wonderful event. If anyone needs a hand to prepare their boat for this event please contact me.

The next highest in the fleet was Pat & Dot Rygh who were in 14th place. (Garrett Jolly, a Jr. did a great job filling in for Dot for the last 2 races after she injured her knee). We had one other entry in the A fleet 59 and he was Steve Mueller who finished in 19th place.

The B fleet had 3 Lidos from our club entering and doing well in a fleet of 13 boats. Morro Bay Yacht Club TIDELANDS ADOPT- A -PARK JOB DESCRIPTION

We clean Tidelands Park, prior to 11 a.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday, from Memorial Day until the end of September. The rest of the year, Monday and Friday.

The key to the Park Supply Room is kept in the Race Locker under the stairs at the Yacht Club.

Tools and supplies are kept in the Park Supply Room at the middle of the south end of the Restrooms, in the Park. Plastic gloves are available in the box on the left wall. You will find a rolling barrel, lined with a black plastic bag (for holding debris) and various other tools, for making the job more convenient.

Pick up all paper, trash, debris, and cigarette butts found in the park site as well as <u>the small area south of</u> the Launch Ramp.

It does not include the parking lot, fish cleaning or boat ramp areas. Visually inspect all tables, benches, barbecues, drinking fountains, play apparatus, etc. for damage and cleanliness.

In the sand box, especially keep an eye out for anything that could be harmful to children, such as sticks, glass, stones, or anything sharp that one could be hurt by.

Empty and reline, as necessary, all ROUND trash containers. Be sure to cut several slits in the bottoms of the plastic bags, before replacing them in all containers, for water from sprinklers to drain.

All refuse can be deposited in the Dumpsters in the park.

The CITY provides all supplies and equipment. Call the Park Staff (722-6278) if you run short.

Alert Park Staff or Police (722-6225) to report vandalism. Complete the INCIDENT REPORT FORM for each incident.

When citizens report to you, provide them with a CITIZEN'S REPORT FORM, to be found in the Supply Room. It is their responsibility to complete the form and mail it to the CITY.

BE SURE TO KEEP THE PARK SUPPLY ROOM LOCKED AT ALL TIMES.


