

Well, the Commodore's Ball is but a memory as we head into the holiday season and the end of a very productive year. By the time you read this the heads should be complete (I know you have heard this before) with bench seats and clothes hooks and the dock should be

outfitted with new electrical outlets and an additional water source with new hose and nozzle.

The new dock electricity didn't just happen, of course. The job was accomplished only with the hard work of several of our members over the course of two days. Next year's Vice Commodore, Dana McClish engineered and oversaw the entire project. Jeff Davidson, Frank Wood, and Staff Commodore Ron May removed the dock boards and ran the new water line. Manny Fimbres and Lewis Wells spent a long day constructing the pedestals that would hold the electrical boxes. Finally, with the help of Harold Hartsell, Jeff Davidson and "uxdegleb" the water lines were completed and the dock boards replaced. Uxdegleb was one of our shy members who didn't want recognition via the Masthead. For those of you who like puzzles the letters can be unscrambled to reveal the true identity of this volunteer. I will provide one hint, he is not the most junior Staff Commodore and he is not better looking than his wife.

We are underway with the electronic key system-Secura Key. Funding for the project was approved at the last board meeting and a contract has been signed and parts have been ordered. Installation should begin after the Thanksgiving holidays and the entire system in operation before the end of the year. Members will have the responsibility of routing the wire from the office to the doors so I will be calling on club members to volunteer some time.

Another exciting project that is underway is the installation of parts necessary to make MBYC a wireless access point. The mastermind behind this project is our own Harold Hartsell who not only convinced the board of the value of the project but also ran the wire and provided a critical piece of the hardware. This system will give members and transients at our dock the ability to access the internet where they can check weather, e-mail, and buoy reports. This system should be available by early December.

A pump out station, electronic key system, wireless access, safe electrical supply on the dock, and new color coordinated heads plus a group of very friendly members makes MBYC the most enviable yacht club on the entire west coast. If you agree, thank the members noted above, and any and all that I have listed over this past year, for making is all happen. Without the generous support of the membership and the hard work of a large number of volunteers none of this would have happened.

May your filters remain free of bad fuel.


