



Ocean Fleet News

The Mullins Memorial race was held on April 23. Winds were predicted to be 10 to 15 knots. The 11-mile course had a short leg out to 18EB, then to Constantine Rock to provide an upwind leg and back home. Califia, Guayacan, Voyager II, and Whizbang were joined by Esperanza, a Challenger 32 owned by Matt Matthews and his wife.

Plans for an upwind leg were foiled by Neptune, who decided upon winds from the west southwest. Whizbang and Voyager II actually started the race with their chutes up, and were able to keep them up after rounding 18EB, with their spinnaker poles straight forward like bow sprits. The chutes came down for an easy close reach on the final leg. When the wind eased Whizbang closed the gap, and when it built Voyager II pulled ahead. In the meantime, the wind direction was entirely favorable to Guayacan, who surged ahead of the other boats and began to pull up on the lead boats. In the end, the corrected times were

I want to remind everyone that we are working with the San Luis Yacht Club to participate in their races scheduled for July 1 and 2. Boats from the SLYC will come up to join us for happy hour on June 30. We will start **earlier** than usual on Saturday due to the difficulty most boats had in completing the passage in last year's light winds. The skippers meeting could be held as early as 0900, with the race starting at 1030 or 1100. We will spend Saturday night on the hook at Avila. Sunday morning we will join the SLYC for brunch at 1000 followed by one or two races. Boats are free to return to Morro Bay at their skippers' leisure.

The yellow buoy that serves as our ocean mark has been found in the custody of the Morro Bay Harbor Department. No formal charges have been filed, so we fully expect to secure the buoy's return without the need to post bail. Our plan is to set the buoy such that it can be retrieved at the end of the season for maintenance and safekeeping while we study more permanent options for when it will be reset at next year's work day.
