

FROM YOUR REAR COMMODORE



It is going to be a busy July for most of the racers. The Ocean Fleet Runs their entire Summer series in the month of July; Summer 1 July 9th, Summer 2 July 23rd, Summer 3 July 30th. The bay fleet travels to Huntington Lake 8th and 9th. The Lido fleets will be busy with their Nationals and Junior Nationals 7th through 13th. The DaySailer Nationals are in Sharron, Massachusetts this year. A couple of local boats are making the travel to that race. We wrap the month up with Howard Prairie, another traveling bay fleet race.

This last month we saw the use of some new mark locations. Probably the most exciting mark is "D" which is being placed down by the HoffBrau. This mark allows for the sailors to do a bit more windward and leeward work around the course. It is an attempt to open up passing lanes in the parade around Morro Bay. A second mark usually "A" is being placed up against the sand spit between channel marker 10 and channel marker 12. Again with the prevailing winds of summer coming straight across the bay, race committees are attempting to create windward and leeward legs. The third and final mark is placed directly across from the club by the sand spit, mark "C". This mark is used to give the fleet a windward start and a leeward finish. Boats have been rounding this mark starting and finishing the race.

Since the introduction of the new marks, DaySailers have had more chances to fly their spinnakers and Lasers have had greater opportunities to death roll. The leeward finishes have made for some great finishes with only five feet dividing first from fourth in the DaySailers at the last race. If you have not been down for a while to watch the races I recommend doing so. Summer 2 saw nineteen boats on the line in the bay and five boats on the line for the Ocean fleet. Great turnout so far this year!

I am still looking for people to Pro races throughout the rest of the year. Please look over the schedule and inform me of which ones fit your schedule best. All bay racers are expected to Pro at least one race per year. If you would like to Pro an upcoming race please give me a call at.



The Spring Series was wrapped up with two days of racing on Saturday and Sunday June 3 and 4. Both races had Bermuda starts with 12-mile courses.

The forecast on Saturday was for a small craft advisory, but you would hardly have known it. The course was once around 18EB, Mouse Rock, Constantine Rock, and home counterclockwise. The participating boats included, in order of start, Guayacan, Esperanza, Ichiban, Kiskedee, Whizbang, and Voyager II.

First Whizbang, then Voyager II slowly overtook the fleet on the way to Mouse Rock. Guayacan was the first to retire. By around 1540 Kiskedee had still not reached Mouse Rock, and we were sick of bobbing around and kicked the motor on, followed by Ichiban. Whizbang was well on the way to Constantine with Voyager II and Esperanza clawing their way past Mouse. Eventually Esperanza called it a day as well, leaving Whizbang with first place and Voyager II with second.


Many of the crewmembers stayed for a steak and chicken barbecue that evening. The planning for this event did not go off with the usual precision, and I have to thank Jim Bruzenak, Susie Berndt, and Lola Fimbres for securing the vital victuals. Ultimately, an enjoyable time was had by all.

On Sunday the fleet grew to seven boats with Guayacan, Califia, Esperanza, Kiskedee, Whizbang, Voyager II, and Troublemaker. A triangular course was set with MB and 18 EB as the base and Cherokee serving as the outer mark, once around counterclockwise then back clockwise. One mile within the shore the winds were calm while the seas were somewhat sloppy. As Cherokee headed out to the appointed station, the wind and seas began picking up one mile out, and it took a full 90 minutes to motor 2.2 miles.

It was blowing like snot out where Cherokee was while the rest of the fleet was becalmed. About an hour later Whizbang and Voyager made their first pass around Cherokee and the other boats radioed they were retiring one by one. After another hour Cherokee encountered a set of rogues up to 12 feet with breaking tops and radioed that the remaining boats could use GPS coordinates if they continued. They were finally on their way, and Whizbang requested Cherokee to wait a few minutes more. The attached photo of Whizbang shows the fun everyone was having.

As soon as both boats were headed back to 18EB Cherokee turned home, cut the engine, and made it back to MB in 20 minutes with the genoa alone. Ultimately Voyager held on to take first with Whizbang second. This put Guayacan in third place for the Pritchett Series with 18 points, Whizbang second with 5, and Voyager II first with 4 points. The trophy wineglasses were given with a dram of rum to reward two difficult days of sailing.

July will be a busy month for the Ocean Fleet, starting with a race to Avila with the San Luis Yacht Club on July 1. The Summer Series will be run three weekends in July on the 9th, 23rd, and 30th. All three will use SoCal PHRF cruising class rules, with rating adjustments for features such as fixed props and roller furling headsails to help cruising boats race more competitively. 


