

### FROM YOUR REAR COMMODORE



The past month of July had many people in the Bay Fleet, and Ocean Fleet traveling. Bob Kyle, John Schmidt, and others went to the McNish in Oxnard. Gail Condon, Michael Measures, Brooks Measures, and myself went to Eugene for DaySailer Pacific Coast Champions. Finally several races went off here at home, out in the ocean and in the bay as well.

### **PROing**

Please note that we still need a few more PRO's for the year. Among them the Wysocki regatta, and a slew of one day regattas here at home. Please check the sign up sheet in the glass at the club if you have not PROed yet this year or if you just enjoy PROing. Running races can be very entertaining and enjoyable. If you are thinking of PROing and have not yet, please let me know.

The nuts and bolts of running a race. We try to set up courses in the bay to make courses that make the boats sail straight upwind and downwind courses. Commonly, I will help set marks and even make suggestions on courses.

### Starting sequence

We run a five minute starting sequence. We sound three horns at six minutes, one horn at five, one horn at four, one horn at one minute, and one horn at the start. The class flag goes up on the five, and down on the start. The preparatory flag goes up at four minutes to start and down at one minute to start. Timing of the flags is critical, horns should be good as well.

### Changes in the Bay Fleet

Additionally, we are allowing the different classes to chose the number of races that they would like to sail for the day. This commonly plays out by the Lido fleet sailing three races and the DaySailer sailing four or more. If you are racing for the series trophy please note that the number of races held each day can vary and will affect your final score if you are absent a day. The fleet that runs more races should be prepared to attend the trophy ceremony upon landing at the dock. Please postpone breaking down your boat until after the ceremony. This new idea was tried out at Fall 1 with Jim Orth, Glinda Boatman, the Raine's, and Michael Brooks. They did a great job at helping the bay fleet solve an old problem, and their bravery was greatly appreciated.

### Ocean Fleet News


The Ocean Fleet held two out their three events, look for a complete account of the Ocean Fleet elsewhere in the Masthead.

# Ocean Fleet News

Just as the ocean itself has its ebb and flow, so does interest in racing with the ocean fleet. In order to kick a little interest into our Summer Series, we added a prize for the best combined results for the Summer 2 and Summer 3 races, which used the PHRF Cruising Class rules to improve the ratings for boats whose design emphasize good cruising features.

The Summer 2 race was attended by *Chiara Mia*, *Guayacan*, *Peggy D*, and *Whizbang*, running a 9 miles course out to the club mark and back followed by a triangle around 18EB, the club mark, and finish. The winds were light. *Whizbang* was able to complete the course in 3 1/2 hours, but *Guayacan* and *Chiara Mia* retired in frustration. *Peggy D* hung in there and finished in the early evening to take second.

I was at Lake Tahoe during Summer 3. My arrangements for a pro fell apart, and Ron May stepped up to the plate to run the race. Five boats showed up with *Whizbang* taking the honors.

That gave *Whizbang* the best overall performance for both the Summer Series and the special prize for the Summer 2 and 3 races. Goofy Graphics generously provided a certificate for vinyl lettering for a boat name and hailing port: a \$60 to \$80 value! If you get by Goofy Graphics, thank them for supporting our ocean races with this valuable prize. I should also note that Manny Fimbres did all the initial leg work so all I had to do was close the deal.

Fall 1 and 2 were held on the weekend of August 12 and 13. Ron May generously agreed to pro Fall 1 as I was driving back from Lake Tahoe that day. The winds were absolutely uncooperative, and after two postponements the fleet retired one by one without a single boat starting.

The following day we had an 8 mile course with lots of reaching in anticipation of light winds. The course was out to 18EB and back, then around the triangle if winds permitted. *Guayacan*, *Peggy D*, *Voyager II*, and *Whizbang* came out to try their luck again. Ron May invited Michael Dobrizensky, the San Luis Yacht Club's race chair, and me aboard *Whizbang* to round out his crew.

The race had an exciting start and finish. Lynn Meissen was leading *Guaycan* to a spot-on start, but *Whizbang* forced her to yield at the windward end of the starting line as the upwind boat. This consequently put *Whizbang* so close that *Guayacan* stole her air, enabling *Voyager II* to surge past. *Whizbang* stayed on *Voyager II* throughout the race, sometimes falling back and sometimes closing the gap. In the end, *Voyager II* held onto first by a mere 10 seconds corrected time. *Whizbang* took second, *Guayacan* third, and *Peggy D* retired.

While our master schedule seems to indicate races on September 9 and 10, consensus seems to be that this is an error. We will make-up Fall 1 on Sunday, September 10. With the main summer vacation season over, we hope more boats will join us for ocean racing.

### MORRO BAY YACHT CLUB POLICY LETTER #16 C Revised

TITLE: Storage Facility Use

1. Storage facilities include the storage shed, tarmac, and boat storage yard.

### A. Storage Shed.

- 1. The Storage shed is to be primarily used for the storage of equipment, supplies, and tools related to the upkeep of the MBYC Clubhouse, grounds and outbuildings.
  - 1a. It shall be the responsibility of the Vice Commodore to be sure that all *the above* items are stored in a neat and tidy manner.
- 2. The *storage shed* is also used for the storage of race committee gear, which includes but is not limited to, markers lines, flags, buoys, and anchors.
- 2a. It shall be the responsibility of the Rear Commodore or his/her designee to be sure that all *the above* items used for a race day are replaced in a neat and tidy order after each use.
- 3. The storage shed is also used for items related to the upkeep of the dock, moorings, boat yard, and club safety boat.
  - 3a. It shall be the responsibility of the Port Captain to keep all *the above* items in a neat and tidy order at all times.
- 4. No fuel, oil, or flammable items may be placed in the *shed* at any time. Per City of Morro Bay Fire Department.
- 5. 1. No unauthorized personal property shall be stored in the storage shed.
- 6. Motors or oars used for dinghies may be stored in the building with prior permission being given by the Port Captain and only after all items are properly identified by the member. The storage of such items is only for members with boats on club moorings and dock and is limited to one motor per boat. It is limited to a first come basis due to space limitations.

### B. Tarmac

1. No unauthorized personal property shall be stored on the Tarmac.

### C. Boat Storage Area

- 1. The boat yard is for the storage of boats and trailers only. 1a. Any exception to this must have the approval of the Port Captain.
- 2. All personal property must be in or on the member's boat.
- 3. All boats must be kept in an aesthetically acceptable condition, i.e. no shredded tarps, moss covered boats, and have current registrations.
- 4. All boats must be stored on a trailer. Trailers must be in a functional condition, i.e. no flat tires, to facilitate yard maintenance.
- 5. All members using the boat yard must have a signed boat storage agreement on file with the Port Captain.
- 6. Rented space in the boat storage yard may not be sublet, transferred, or offered as part of the sale of a members boat. Space made available by the sale of a boat will be offered to the member next on the waiting list.

### MORRO BAY YACHT CLUB BOARD OF DIRESTORS POLICY LETTER NO. 21 A

TITLE: Volunteerism

Introduction:

The club was established in 1956 with the purpose of being a boatman's organization that anyone could afford. In 1957 the club was incorporated with the specific and primary purposes of encouraging pleasure boating; promoting races and cruises; promote boating safety and seamanship, and to promote the interests of yachting in general. A final purpose was to conserve and administer the property of the club.

To meet these purposes the club needs an infrastructure that includes a clubhouse with shower, galley, and bar for meeting, planning and socializing. Additionally, there is the need for a boat storage yard, hoist, storage shed, gangway, dock, and mooring field for both member and transient boats. To make all this affordable the club has always depended on its membership to do much of the cleaning, maintenance of the facilities, and administration.

The purpose of this letter is to help define the nature of volunteerism as it pertains to membership in the MBYC. POLICY:

- 1. Our application to join lists a variety of club activities available for prospective members to choose from as areas of interest and participation. The choice is strictly voluntary. The application also states the expectation that members will, in addition to the area they indicate and interest in, serve as Happy Hour Host (approximately every 16 months depending on the number of members), and participate in Work Days.
  - 1a. Even voluntary activity needs to be organized and planned and the organizers need to know who is available and when. To this end, lists of volunteers are solicited for events or assigned to a variety of activities.
  - 1b. The Board of Directors realizes that some conditions exist that warrant **permanent removal** for volunteer requirements and lists, The reasons include:
    - a. Having reached the status of life member.
    - b. Having a health condition that prohibits participation.
    - c. A financial hardship that prohibits participation.
    - d. Residency out of state or beyond a reasonable distance from MB.

If any of the above apply the person need notify the board by letter <u>once</u> requesting permanent removal for all voluntary expectations.

- 1c. If a **temporary condition** exists the member need notify the board or coordinator of the activity, by letter **each time** there is a need to be excused. For example, if you request removal from your scheduled Happy Hour Hosting, Work Day, Tideland's Park, etc., your name will be removed **for that time only** but returned to the list for future activities. Acceptable reasons here would include:
  - a. Travel conflicts.
  - b. Family emergencies.
  - c. Health Issues.
- 2. Happy Hour Hosting assignments are made three months before the member's scheduled Friday night and are posted in the Masthead. The Social Hour Coordinator also notifies the member by U.S. Mail three to four weeks prior to the member's scheduled time to host. If a member realizes they have a conflict after their names have appeared in the Masthead they should:
  - 1. attempt to change places with another member on the list, or
  - 2. contact the Social Hour Coordinator (name and number are listed in the Masthead)
  - 2a. If a member is unable to meet their Happy Hour commitment, and they have **requested temporary** removal from Happy Hour Hosting, they **may** make a \$50.00 contribution to the MBYC Friday Night Happy Hour Activity Account.
- 3. The authority that underlies this Policy Letter rest on what the member agrees to on their membership application. Should the member decide not to volunteer for any activity, they may request, by letter to the board, to be removed permanently from all voluntary expectations. This last option, though not a common choice, makes membership in MBYC voluntary.
