# FROM YOUR COMMODORE

Ahoy Mates,

All were there except those who were square-there was Johnny Angel, greasers, motorcycles and more than a few of the really "cool" in attendance at the 50's party. Among the "cool" attending were John Gajdos and Elaine Giannini who are now our newest club members. When you see them around the club, give them a warm welcome.

You only have until November 1st to get your reservations in for the Commodore's Ball, and, as Commodore, I do expect all to attend. Also, keep in mind that Saturday, November 4th is our General Meeting that will be preceded by a potluck dinner. With a full stomach and a glass of wine all will be ready for the General Meeting which promises to have something of interest to all

The agenda for the General Meeting will include votes on the request of three members for Life Membership, a motion brought to the Board for a change in the By-Laws that would add the Port Captain to the Board along with a third Director, a request from the Board that funds be provided from our reserves to install an elevator, and a dues increase of \$75.00.

As the Commodore, and as a member of this club, I feel that each of these issues deserves serious attention on the part of the membership. The Port Captain's job is huge and critical to the welfare of the club and deserves, in my opinion, the authority that comes with being a member of the Board. We now have three-year terms for Directors and it only makes sense to me to have one elected each year. I would also suggest that we make it customary, rather than mandatory, that the outgoing Commodore serves as the new Director. Since we elect new Board members each year having the immediate past Commodore on the Board will provide needed continuity.

Last year we spent a lot of money remodeling the heads. As the Vice Commodore in charge of that project I felt there were two objectives to be met. One was the obvious one that it was time to upgrade, repair and modernize. The other was to gain compliance with the law, specifically those related to the Americans with Disabilities Act, which requires places with public access to be accessible to those with disabilities. As far as the heads and the downstairs areas are concerned, conformity to the ADA has been met. All we have left to be fully compliant with ADA is to make the upstairs accessible. This is where the elevator comes in. Dana McClish, the Vice Commodore, has spent a great deal of time investigating this project and will make his proposal at our General Meeting. In my opinion an elevator will complete our obligation to those who have disabilities and to members who just find it difficult getting upstairs where the action is most of the time.

If unable to attend, it is your RESPONSI-BILITY to find a replacement. Perhaps you could trade with someone else on the Host List.



Staff Commodore Salas is the chair of the Nominating Committee and, along with committee members Staff Commodore Ron May and member Bob Kizziar, are hard at work seeking out those willing to serve. An upcoming item to be voted on at the November General Membership Meeting will be the installation of a wheelchair lift to be located on the exterior of the building near the location of the BBQ. I've been looking into this for some time now and I have a bid for the appropriate model for our use. Basically, it would be an enclosed elevator shaft going up to the landing at the top of the stairs with a 42" high lift car inside. The unit will be constructed of galvanized steel and aluminum with tinted acrylic panels. This finish will best handle the salt air. Some site preparation will need to be provided, such as: electrical power, concrete work, and landing alterations. All in all, your Board of Directors believe this addition will serve our club well. A chair lift such as this one will complete the bulk of our A.D.A. compliance and of course provide much needed access for a portion of our membership, not to mention some relief in stocking the bar. So please come to the November General Membership Meeting and vote to fund this project.


