FROM YOUR COMMODORE

Ahoy Mates,

While in a thanking mood, I want to extend a big thank you to Manny Fimbres for the excellent job he and his assistants have done in running and managing the bar. Most of you should get this by the time of our General Meeting, Saturday November 4th, so I'll briefly discuss the issues you will be asked to vote on. First of all, you should have received a first class mailing of all the proposals. They were mailed to your home address October 4th. The issues include a petition to the Board to change our by-Laws making the Port Captain a member of the Board, and adding a third Director to keep the Board at an odd number. A second issue is the purchase of an elevator to complete our building's improvement for meeting ADA requirements. The third is a two- part motion for a dues increase. Part A is a maximum \$50.00 increase that would go to the operating budget, and Part B is a maximum \$25.00 increase that would go to the Long range Planning and Contingency Fund. It is from this fund that we paid for the head remodel last year, and from which we would pay for the elevator, if approved.

If you have been around our club in the last couple of months you may have noticed the large number of transient boats that have visited our dock. Our Port Captain, Jeff Davidson, has been working overtime with all the visitors. Most were heading south for the annual Baja Ha-ha into Mexico and the warm weather it promises during the winter months. We have two members who will be joining the other 180 plus boats for the trip and they are, Wayne Ratliff on the s/v Voyager and Peter Behman on the s/v Kiskedee. I understand that both Captains shanghaied crews the night before sailing from the Fuel Dock (previously known as Happy Jacks). Wayne will return home, while Peter will continue for an extended stay in Mexico. Good luck to them all.

Please don't forget to get your reservation in for the Commodore's Ball, November 11th. The *mail in deadline is November 1st.* Forms are available upstairs and money & forms can be mailed MBYC or placed in our club mailbox. Any questions please call Rachelle.






FROM THE PORT CAPTAIN'S DOCK




