


Now that the December party warm-up is complete, don't miss the last chance to party this year on New Year's Eve. Come down to the club and ring in the new year.

We have a new applicant, Jerry White, who is being sponsored by Kevin Williams and Ed Carnegie. Please take time to meet him.





Voyager II and crew, Candy Botich, Mark Beem, Kevin O'Day, and Gustavo Prieto did the Baja Haha rally this year. The start was in San Diego on October 30 and ended in Cabo San Lucas on November 9 with two stops, in Bahia Tortuga (Turtle Bay) and in Bahia Santa Maria (just north of Mag Bay). Each of the stops was two days and each had a party on shore for all the participants and the locals. We bashed our way back, leaving Cabo on Nov. 13, and visiting a number of small anchorages as we came back up the coast.

What is a Baja Haha, you might ask? It isn't a strict race; they even call it a rally. Early and/or late starts are allowed; it apparently isn't required to actually cross the finish line and using your iron jib is okay (although pure sailing is rewarded). And the worst you can do is to get third place in your division. It's more like a convoy of boats going to Cabo.

The first leg was about 360 miles and took us 2 nights and three days. We flew our gennaker all the first night and went wing-and-wing all the second night. The winds in Mexico always seem to be dead on your stern or right on your nose. It seemed like anytime we changed our sail trim to match a change in the wind, the wind immediately resumed its old course and speed. But one good thing was the steady warming and clearing trend. The water temperature got to the high 70's by the time we got to Turtle Bay where a quick dip was most invigorating and was in the 80's and 90's by the time we got to Cabo.

The second leg was 240 miles to Bahia Santa Maria, a primitive fishing outpost but with a comfortable charm that defies imagination. And then 180 miles to Cabo with several blowout parties and festivities including the "We cheated death again" at El Squid Roe.

When I told Wayne I was willing to do these things, his response was, "That's great! I was worried that you were more burned out than that!"




