I want to thank Gail Condon, Doug Gould, Ron Giddings and Lex Budge for their outstanding job as instructors in the Whaler & Racing Clinic last Saturday. I would guess that 40 to 50 people showed up during the day. The Whaler familiarization probably drew the biggest crowd but I was a little surprised at the intensity of interest in the rules class. I think some students spent the entire two hours with Ron Giddings. I think Gail got energized by the PRO class; she didn't want to stop teaching even at lunch / noon. It was also Juniors BYOB day (that's Bring Your Own Boat for Juniors) and many of the juniors also went through the PRO class. If anyone has suggestions about the classes, please bring them to my attention. I have had requests for another Whaler Learning day for those who could not attend the May 19 class, and several people expressed interest in a Whaler training that involved more on-the-water work.

But wait, I have an idea of how to get on-the-water experience: assist a bay race PRO/crash boat and co-drive with an experienced crash boat driver. By the same token, now that a number of you have recently gotten PRO training, use and enlarge that training by assisting a PRO on any race day.

PRO's needed! We need a PRO and helpers for the Bay race on Summer #2 on 23 June and Summer #3 on 21 July.

The Ocean Summer Series uses "Cruising Class Rules" which is to say, that no racers will fly spinnakers and handicaps are adjusted for things like roller furling and various propeller configurations. The Ocean Fleet and its captain, John Michener, have decided to extend the "Cruising Class Rules" through the Fall series. This class certainly reduces the whiteknuckle aspect of racing and makes for more relaxed sailing. For those of you

that don't have spinnakers or don't have the trained crew or are cruisers more than hard-core racers, this is a good way to get into the race.




