

It has been a busy month so far for the Port Captain and will probably continue to be so as I attempt to get a handle on the job.

Thoma Electric responded quickly to my call reporting a grounding problem on the dock, and later, reported to me that all had been repaired. Warren Thomas was called to relocate Mooring #16 which had been pulled from its original location and Greg Larson's boat "Jake" was moved to Mooring #12 until #16 was relocated. All boats seemed to ride out the January storm without dif-

ficulty but some dinghys still need to be dewatered and all members on a mooring should check their pendant to make sure it is in good shape and ready for any additional weather that may come our way.

I have posted a revised and updated mooring assignment sheet, and a revised mooring and boatyard waiting list for your viewing pleasure. Should any of you who are on any of these revised lists have questions please contact me. If you have a boat on one of our moorings you are required to provide me with a copy of your current boat insurance. The boat's liability insurance must be for a minimum of \$250,000 per claim, or \$500,000 per event. I await with great anticipation the receipt of these documents.

I want to thank Don Lockwood, Doug MacDonald, Lynn Meissen, and Larry Earl for volunteering to serve as assistant Port Captains for 2008.

FROM YOUR VICE COMMODORE

.Well the only news from my side is the hoist overhaul. You may have noticed it sitting in the boatyard. We had some nasty surprises as we took it down, the top flange bearing was mostly hydrated ferric oxide powder (in the simple language of sailors, this substance is often just called "rust"). So that the hoist's mast was riding on the pin that sticks out of the mast at the top was slowly grinding into the top plate. There was no imminent danger; it would have taken several more decades before it fell over.

The second surprise was the gearbox that rotates the hoist was broken in such a way that it is hard to understand how it worked at all. So far as I can tell, this gearbox is older than the clubhouse, so I guess we got our money's worth. Like Helen of Troy, it has launched a thousand ships.

As this is being written, the hoist structure is basking in the resort town of Madera awaiting its turn for the molten zinc tank, after sandblasting and three brief swims in caustic lye, hot acid, and flux solution. Sort of like a trip to the spa with dermabrasion, acid peel, and a sauna bath.

I shudder to think how this job would have gone without the help of Bob Kile. I think it could have been done, but it would have taken longer, been of far lower quality and costlier. Many mornings at 8 o'clock, Bob would call me and talk about hoist issues that had come to him during the night. I also especially want to thank Jim Bruzenak for his support, counsel, and being ground crew when I was up in the cherry picker. Thanks to Terry Paris and Howard Grisham who helped take the hoist down and customize the sawhorses to the hoist parts. Lots of members helped out, usually by of-

fering help as they passed through. Kevin Williams donated the use of his 20 ft. boat trailer to transport the hoist to Cal Poly and to Madera, Lex endangered his restaurant hands by helping remove the winch assembly, Rear Commodore John Michener has always been there for me (except for a family emergency), he drove the trailer to Madera, and finally, thanks to the loading crew, Dana McClish, Kent Butler, Peter Behman, and Lynn Meissen.



At the risk of sounding like an advertisement, Dewayne's Crane was incredibly easy to work with and Moore Quality Galvanizing was surprisingly accommodating as well as Central Coast Bearing in San Luis.

Hot-dip galvanizing, the broken gearbox, and weather have introduced delays in the overhaul schedule. I still have high hopes of having the hoist usable for the Feb. 3rd Bay Race, but it might be necessary to use the boat launch ramp.

Junior Staff Commodore Dana tells me that organizing work day is the hardest part of being vice commodore. I'm counting on your help and support on March 8 (March 15 alternate). In the meantime, please let me know of items in the clubhouse that need workday attention.

The Bay race signup schedule is posted in the case beneath the club stairway for Bay Fleet PRO's and there is a list for people who are available for race committee. If a Bay Fleet boat does not sail in one series race because skipper/crew are on the



race committee, the average of the boat's score in the other 2 races of the series will be used for the race missed. So missing a race to work on the race committee will not keep you from being able to win a trophy for any series.

I encourage Ocean Fleet people to also get involved by volunteering to work on the race committee for bay races. The Bay Fleet can in turn help the Ocean Fleet by volunteering to crew on the Ocean Fleet boats. If you would like to get involved and help out please email me.

Proof of current liability insurance for boats on club moorings are due.










Member of MBYC Passes: Joyce Cotton


