

If this is your first HOST ASSIGNMENT, contact the couple assigned with you and they will show you the ropes.


If unable to attend, it is your RESPONSI-BILITY to find a replacement. Perhaps you could trade with someone else on the Host List.


FROM YOUR VICE COMMODORE




Social Committee


