# FROM YOUR COMMODORE-Wayne Ratliff

#### Hello sailors,

Whew! Opening Day and the April General Meeting have been completed. I feel like we have rounded the weather mark and now are on a downwind leg. Opening Day was made possible by the extreme efforts of Vice Commodore John Michener and his cast of thousands (actually only a hundred or so) and Social/Activities Chairwoman Elaine Giannini and her cast of thousands (actually less than 50 or so). Thanks to everyone who contributed food, served food, helped out during the day's events, painted, repaired, weeded, cleaned, paraded, shot cannons, rang bells, raised flags, bartended, received guests, moved furniture, decorated, played music, PRO'ed, M/C'ed,



photographed, and cleaned up. And a personal thanks to everyone who made my mother and sister feel welcome.

The *General Meeting* had no ballot items and so was primarily a reporting of many of the officers and committee chairs. There were special reports on the elevator/lift and on the ocean buoy. The *Vice Commodore* and I are disappointed with the low volume of elevator lift surveys returned. We believe that it is vital that the elevator/lift committee understand where the membership's wants and desires lay in order to properly prepare a proposal (or two). Without direction from the membership, the committee might easily spin their wheels on an approach that is not supported by the members. Even if you have no strong or specific feelings about the elevator/lift, please fill out a survey and say whatever it is that you do feel.

The ocean buoy proposals seemed way too expensive at first hearing. Then *Director Dana* pointed out that, when the cost is annualized over eight years, it is less than what we budg-eted. So *Greg's* RFP and responses are starting to look a lot better.

I have a plan for increasing the load that the hoist can safely lift. Currently, the *Port Captain* and I have set the limit at 1000 lbs. The new plan would exactly double that to 2000 lbs. Engineering calculations indicate that the hoist structure is able to support 10,000 lbs. with a factor of seven safety margin (by that I mean that it would probably fall over if we tried to lift 70,000 lbs.). The limiting factor is the 3/4 horsepower hoist motor. I know there are a couple of 20+ foot boats that are likely candidates for use. And hoisting the whaler would become safe and easy on the hoist motor. If you might become a hoist user, should the hoist capacity be doubled, please get in contact with me before the next board meeting.

Now that the yachting season is officially open, I am looking forward to a lot of sailing, ocean racing, bay racing, ocean cruising, and bay fun cruises. Which is to say: the real business of the *Morro Bay Yacht Club*.

# FROM THE PORT CAPTAIN—Kevin Williams



Hello Everyone.

I have been wrapping up a very busy month at the club. Please keep in mind that the *Port Captain* is an appointed position, not elected. I serve at the pleasure of the *Commodore*. All of my decisions are run through either the Commodore, or the entire *Board*. The board does not endorse all of my actions, but they do call for action on issues of importance to them. So

starting from the top. We are going to keep the dingy limitation to ten feet, including outboard. This is to make it easier for everyone to row in and out from behind the dock. I originally had written a *Masthead* article pleading for everyone to perform some self regulation. I am glad to say that all but one person has complied and that person will be receiving certified mail asking for an immediate correction. Next in line, the boat yard is booming. We have added new active members and new active boats. We will have had three non-active boats go out of the boat yard, but there are always more boats sitting than those that sail regularly. We will continue to promote spaces for active boats and move non-active boats from the yard.

Now back to the moorings. The mooring field was originally intended to serve "active boats". There is verbiage that clearly states "use it or lose it". Please be sure that you fit within the Policy letters provided to you if you are renting a mooring from the club. Our moorings are to be rented by active, sail. In addition, please keep in mind that if you rent a mooring from the club you are "required" to keep your boat in a manner in accordance with the yacht club, code for "clean and serviceable". It is to these ends that I will now turn my focus. A "used" boat is one that participates in club events, does some sailing, if it is a sailboat, or some motoring, traveling. If your definition of use is a place to have some drinks and relax on your mooring, you may want to consider another landlord than the Yacht Club. To place some perspective and conclude, the Yacht Club's assets are to be used for active sailors. It is to these ends that the Yacht Club's main mission states, "to encourage pleasure boating in this area, to promote races and cruises, to promote safety and seamanship, to promote the interests of yachting in general."




