FROM YOUR COMMODORE - Greg Barker



It's 0850 in the morning, and Paris is just waking up, so I figure on getting in some work on this month's column before they start serving breakfast. Actually, a couple of places in the neighborhood are open, and there are one or two lonely souls quietly sipping coffee in about every other café, a stark contrast to Friday midnight.

Earlier this week I was in Barcelona, and planned to make a big deal of visiting one or both of their two yacht clubs. I even packed a burgee to exchange, but it was not to be. One evening part of our group was lead down to Port Vell unexpectedly for dinner. Restaurants in Barcelona don't even want to see you until 8:15, so we just kept walking until we hit the ocean, and by that time they were starting to seat

people in the cafes facing the port. I didn't

even have our burgee with me, so I had to settle for the accompanying shot of me backed by the sailboats in the port.

On a whim, I have decided to include something in this month's column of a substantive nature. I received an abundance of useful suggestions on the Commodore's Ball after I asked for your opinions in last month's column. Treasurer Mary Monroe and I are working on a financial matter that warrant's the input of the members.



For some time now, the club has been using certificates of deposit for funds that are unlikely to require immediate access. Last year the board gritted our teeth and rolled maturing CDs into new ones even through the rates had gotten positively moribund. So far this year, rates are somewhere between moribund and nothing, and we are investigating other options.

For those of you who also slept during economics class, return on investment usually improves with risk. Somewhere for every investor, there is that perfect balance between risk and return. To expand the clubs investments beyond federally protected choices like certificates of deposit, we first need an investment policy statement (IPS) to guide future decisions. Think of it as a policy letter for club investments, recognized by brokers, lawyers, and judges because we use the name they are all familiar with.

Here is how you can help, and all it requires from you is to bend my ear when you see me. What would you find an acceptable level of financial risk for the club to undertake? Must we preserve our capital under all circumstances? Are investments that historically have brief downturns acceptable as provided long-term gains are above average? Do you have a horse in the fifth that's a sure bet? Let me, or any of the board members know how you feel about this, because we have to craft a policy that is supported by the membership.

Greetings All,

I write this on May 20th for the June edition of the Masthead. As a note of interest, the Use of Clubhouse Policy was amended at the past board meeting. This was a clarification more than a change. The policy now defines members who may reserve the club as Regular (including Life) and Associate Members. An issue recently came up where a student member had made a request to reserve the clubhouse. A determination was made that it was not intended for student

members to be eligible for that activity and the policy letter now reflects that action. The application will be updated to reflect this clarified policy.

Maintenance costs around the club have been minimal and well within budgeted amounts. Two projects that I anticipate will be undertaken within the next couple of months both involve stairways. The outside stairway is showing signs of weathering and the inside stairway is showing signs of wear. I may be calling on some of you to share your expertise on how to tackle both of these projects. However, don't be concerned that expertise equates to work. I will be looking for others to put the expertise into action.




You're right they are in front, but why??




