
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HAPPY HOUR HOSTS

FROM YOUR REAR COMMODORE - Bob Walker

May had a very full racing schedule with more than our share of wind, which now, however, has been replaced with "June gloom".

OCEAN FLEET NEWS

The leadership of the ocean fleet has changed with the resignation of Ron May as fleet Captain due to health reasons. John Michener has agreed to fill the position. The Ocean Fleet has started and completed their Spring Series.

Here is a terrific description of the Ocean Fleet's **Spring I** Series race provided by port captain and race participant Wayne Ratliff:

It was an amazing day. The club mark was in place. Three boats entered, Voyager II, Geronimo, and Beauty, a J-130. We started light air: Voyager was completely stalled shortly after her start. The

ala Bermuda in very light air; Voyager was completely stalled shortly after her start. The wind started picking up in 10 minutes or so to a pleasant 10-15 kts true, although variable in direction. Later the winds built up to 20-22 kts true.

The last leg got interesting when Voyager caught up to and passed Geronimo. Geronimo tried to set a spinnaker but had problems. After apparently fixing their issues and about two boat lengths behind Voyager, she broached out of control. They tore their spinnaker to shreds and were unable to cross the finish line. We tried to offer assistance but none was needed. They eventually got under full control in the lee of MB rock.

Beauty finished on the wrong side of MB-1 but I awarded them 2nd place anyway since they are new to the venue and may have misunderstood the race instructions. Later, at the dock, a transient boat crashed into Geronimo from behind. No injuries but Tony's backstay was damaged. I called the Harbor Patrol who made a report. They indicated that the club (AKA Port Captain) did not need to take any further action. Early in the race Geronimo ripped a jib. Not a good day for Tony.

Only two boats participated in **Spring II race**. Both boats raced with very small crews, the Skipper, and one crewman. The winds were light and variable. Guayacan withdrew from the race due to mechanical problems. The adjacent picture was taken from Guayacan's deck. As the only boat that finished the race, Team Morris on Baloo was awarded first place.

Spring III, the final race in the Spring series, was held Sunday, June 19, 2011. That's Fathers Day!! Who is in charge of the racing schedule? Three boats started the race and one finished. Team Muther on Evening Tide was first place.


After settling a three way tie Series trophy was awarded to Team Muther.

Hello... Hello - Any cruisers out there??

Well, we're halfway through our 2011 cruising season, and we've successfully completed two cruising events. We had a nice heavy air sail up to San Simeon on 4/30. 2 boats participated: Voyager II (Wayne Ratliff) and Training Wheels (Truman and Lauren Prewitt). The Prewitts found the 25+ kt winds and a steep, short sea to be a tad unsavory for their Coronado 25, and returned to port. Voyager II kept on trucking uphill and enjoyed a fantastic night in the anchorage. I was unable to personally sail up, so I hitched a ride on land with a kayak and surf launched just in time for cocktails, dinner, a night on the hook, and a great sail home.

On June 10-12, Voyager II was the sole representative vessel from MBYC to enjoy a warm welcome from our yachting friends at the SLYC. We started off motoring around 11:00 AM on Friday, and a few miles out the wind started to build. When we got down to Pt. Buchon, we had a stiff 20 kt+ breeze on our back and surfed with consistent 8-10.5 boat speeds. A nice trip in under 3 hours! We had a great time as guests of SLYC, including a complimentary mooring and drinks for happy hour. Andrew Wise and myself represented by closing Mr. Rick's down, and were surprised to come back to the boat with the Voyager II deep into philosophical musings!
