

"The two ocean races for July were so much fun for all participants, we hardly noticed that it was a race. July 10, Devlin II, 3 boats started, Whiz Bang, Lynn Meissen on Guayacan and Gerry Luhr on Nanka. It was a very slow start in light air despite a forecast of a brisk 20-25 knots. For the first hour we were making good only about 15 degrees on a tack; it did bode well for even making the first mark, MBYC. Guayacan was almost calling to quit the race and go see the whales,





which were spouting all over Estero Bay. Then just after 1300, the shorten course time, the wind picked up and within 15 minutes we went from 2 knots to 6 knots. The sun was shining, it was warm, and we were sailing amid the whales, which had been around for almost a week. Whiz Bang was first across the line, Guayacan came in second. It was a wonderful day."



The High Sierra Regatta has been the focus of the Bay Fleet this past month. If you weren't there to share in the fun, you really missed a great racing event. MBYC was well represented with sailors in the Optis, Lasers, Day Sailers, Bryan Monroe's new boat, a "570", which I am told is only slightly faster than our Day Sailers.



#### In Remembrance

#### **Gail Spencer**

Club member Gail Spencer passed away Thursday, June 30 after a year and a half battle with multiple myeloma, survived by her husband of 47 years, Tom Spencer. Gail and Tom met while racing sailboats in the Bay Area, most recently enjoying their Beneteau 35.7 Pegasus. Gail also spent almost three decades in the sport of dressage and breeding horses. #### Roy Shank

Past Commodore Roy Shank peacefully passed away earlier in July after a very long illness. His obituary was published in the San Luis Obispo Tribune and which, in summary, contained the following information:

Roy Shank was born in Big Springs, Texas in 1922, served in the US Army Air Corps during WWII, attended the University of Utah, married Joann Penard in 1948 in Indianapolis, moved to Utah, then Billings, Montana, moved to California in 1959, was active in the Coast Guard Auxiliary, the Morro Bay Yacht Club and the American Red Cross. He is survived by his wife Jo, his sons Greg and Terry and five grandchildren.

Beyond the limitations of the obituary, many of our yacht club's longer-term members may recall his extraordinary participation in the club's administration and its activities. He served as Membership Chairman for many years and then as Commodore. In each of these offices, as well as other responsibilities he accepted, he was most thorough and competent.. And earlier, he layed down the lines for our very unique half sailboat hull bar as well as aided with the negotiations with the City for the development of our second floor facilities.

More recently, and for six years, he headed up our Wednesday Hamburger Nights. In this, he worked hard to keep the costs to the club at a minimum, with weekly trips to San Luis Obispo for discount foods and supplies. And days of cooking preparation at home and the galley beforehand. To provide for additional club income and a worthwhile service, he kept the galley refrigerator loaded with pre-made sandwiches that could be purchased by our skippers, their crews and others involved in our racing activities. He also worked with the Morro Bay Coast Guard for many years to assist in its participation in our Opening Day events.

Roy organized the area district Coast Guard Auxiliary in Santa Maria and was its Captain. And some years ago was the Director of the American Red Cross in San Luis Obispo where he developed its initial training courses and certification for artificial respiration.

Well-read and with many interests, skills and experiences, to many of us he was entertaining and instructive in his discourses on a multiple of subjects (his family referred to him as "the professor"). But most of all. despite a series of illnesses, he remained active and involved in the affairs of our club and was most appreciative of its organization and its members, many of whom he valued as his friends.

\*\*\*\*\*

Our hearts go out to Jo Shank and family as Roy died recently, having suffered ill health following a fall on Memorial Day last year. Typical of his patriotism, he was struggling to raise the flag. A lifetime member of the Club, Roy was also a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary and often served us on safety boat patrol. My first introduction was being fished out and wrapped in a blanket by Roy, having capsized my Toro bow first up by the stacks.

Roy and Jo, I believe, instigated the Hamburger Nights and did it almost single handedly for years. Roy really balked at raising the price from One dollar!

Older members will remember and join me in wishing Jo peace.
