
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HAPPY HOUR HOSTS

FROM YOUR OCEAN FLEET CAPTAIN

October has been an exceptionally active month for the ocean fleet. There were 3 races and a cruise, some of which I'll report out next month. For now, here is a recap of some really fun Ocean Fleet races.

Summer III (Aug 28)

It was an interesting sign up: Nanka now becoming a regular, a catamaran trailing along to investigate the race course and maybe start a whole new fleet - always welcome. The entrants Nanka, Guayacan, Gracie Rae, Whiz Bang, Evening Tide. The fog never dissipated so GPS was our lifeline. We saw the marks at a distance of 0.15 nm. Still, we had the equipment and finished the race. And it was fun - the wind was consistent 5-10 knots and the challenge was the navigation. We were isolated on a very big sea. It was fun!

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Lady at the Helm Race (Sept 24)

The most important thing at the beginning of a sailboat race is the weather:

Last Sunday's dawn was beautiful and remained so all day. Sunny, warm and gently breezy was perfect for the Lady at the Helm race. Four boats started-four very disparate boats. The heaviest in the MBYC ocean fleet, Guayacan, (15 tons displacement); the lightest and newest in the fleet was Brian Monroe's StormBringer (300 lbs displacement); a guest entrant Ken Muther brought out Evening Tide with Bonny at the helm and Joe Fram as crew. And long absent from our races Pandora on Califia also started. All sailed well at 4-5 knots (or each made some equalizing mistakes) and the finishing times proved that PHRF handicapping can work to equalize very different boats. Our corrected times were spread over a few minutes.









At the time of the start Evening Tide was so far away from the startline that it isn't in the photo. She was doing some practice maneuvers and "kinda forgot to start" according to Ken, her owner. Guayacan miscalculated and had to make a second costly tack to round MBYC. StormBringer had some kind of problem with the spinnaker and didn't fly it. Pandora perhaps sailed a perfect course.

Corrected times were: StormBringer 52:15; Califia 51:47; Guayacan 52:15; Evening Tide 1:45:2

O'Daniels Two Sticker (Oct 9) The Two-Sticker never has many entrants despite the beauty of Two Stickers (personal opinion only). Nanka, Ho'oluana (the MacDonald family) and Guayacan showed up. It was slow going with variable wind so we agreed to shorten course and finished the 6 miles in 1:58:28 for Ho'oluana, and 2:48:19 for Guayacan (corrected times 1:44:23 and 2:18:38 respectively)

Devlin 3 (Oct 16)

It was another race and fabulous day of sailing. We considered setting a shorter course but opted to just have more bail outs if the wind was disappointing. It wasn't and we were so glad to be out there for the full 15 miles. We went past 18 EB to Constantine buoy past Mouse Rock to No1 then a final loop around 18. The wind was fresh and the sea exceptionally flat. We could lay the course from 18 to Constantine - an unusual circumstance. Geronimo and Whiz Bang led the fleet but were never out of sight. Guayacan and Califia were doing well. Handicap played a big role in a long race and put Guayacan first on corrected time, Whiz Bang second and Geronimo third.


