Please take one minute to review the current roster before you read further. The 2012 roster will be going to print soon and this will be the last opportunity to make any changes or corrections. The Board took action at the January board meeting to approve the Dervin's as our newest members and to grant life memberships to the Butler's and the Schwenoa's. Congratulations to all.

An additional item that the board took action on was to adopt a payment plan for club initiation fees. This is important for everyone to know so when you speak with prospective members you can explain the plan. Rather than the total \$750 initiation fee being due upon submission of the application, a check for not less than \$150 is submitted with the application. Monthly payments of not less than \$100 are to be made until the balance is paid. This board policy was adopted in accordance with the club's by-laws, which allows for payments over a period not to exceed 6 months. Hopefully, this plan will assist each of you as you recruit new members into our club.

As a matter of information, the Budget Committee will be meeting on February 4th at 10 am at the club. We will be setting the proposed budget for 2012 as well as reviewing the final income and expenses of 2011. The proposed budget will go before the board for adoption at the February board meeting.

A great discussion during the January board meeting was about how familiar, or not familiar, some members may be with the MBYC Policy Letters. I encourage you all to review and become aware of the various policies. The Policy Letters are on the club's website member page and also in the bookcase at the club. There will not be a test but I may have a pop quiz for a few select members. Happy reading.

Finally, thanks to the unsung heroes of the club who have volunteered to chair or participate in committees, handle assistant port captain duties, do cleanup at Tidelands Park and jump in when help is needed. It's a team effort and everyone, working together, makes it happen. Thank you.

I have spent much of January learning the duties of the Vice Commodore. As I look around the Club it is apparent that there are a lot of things we can spend our time and money on. The possible projects range from some aggressive cleaning to repair and replacement of decking, siding, and stairs. In the next week or so I plan to post a list of projects that we would like to complete BEFORE our annual workday. If there is something you think needs attention, I would be glad to talk with you.

An update on the "gangway" project: Pat Hedges and I have met Morro Bay city officials to get a better understanding of how city permitting, ADA requirements, and Coastal Commission regulations apply to our project. We know a lot more than we did a few weeks ago and I think with a few changes in the plan, we can meet all the regulatory requirements.

Now to a more serious issue. Frequently, the sewer line serving the men's "head" gets plugged. The plugging seems to be a random occurrence. 





Playing by the Rules:

Did you know that MBYC bay race committees add a couple of extra courtesies to the official rules of racing? If you travel out of town for other races you will notice that not everyone does it like MBYC. For instance, we will give a 6 minute attention horn to signal the 5 minute start sequence, we call out sail numbers that are Over Early at the start, and also call sail numbers at finish line. These practices are nice but not required. Here are the rules directly from US Sailing, The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2009-2012:

26. STARTING RACES

Races shall be started by using the following signals. Times shall be taken from the visual signals; the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded.

	Flag and sound	Minutes before starting signal
Warning	Class flag; 1 sound	5*
Preparatory	P, I, Z, Z with I, or black flag; 1 sound	4

One-minute Preparatory flag removed; 1 long sound 1
Starting Class flag removed; 1 sound 0

29. RECALLS

29.1 Individual Recall - When at a boat's starting signal any part of her hull, crew or equipment is on the course side of the starting line, the race committee shall promptly display flag X with one sound. The flag shall be displayed until all such boats are completely on the pre-start side of the starting line...


Morro Bay Junior Yachi Club
