Another month is upon us and we look for to Mothers Day and May flowers.

As I write this month's column, let me start with the third item first. Staff Commodore Don Lockwood has been coordinating the biennial maintenance of the club's moorings. Aside from our annual lease payments to the city, this is the largest expense to the club, albeit every other year. It gives us an opportunity to more accurately assess our expenses and to manage the mooring field when we have current dollar numbers to work with.

I bring this to your attention as we will be analyzing our expenses and evaluating what the club charges members for use of a mooring. This

information will be discussed at the May Board meeting on May 17th. We will also evaluate the fees for boat storage on shore.

The analysis will be sent out, in advance, via the club's "alias" e-mail list. If you currently receive club e-mails, you will receive the analysis. If you are not currently receiving e-mails from the club, please send me your e-mail address and we will get you included. (I moved this item to the top of the column for those who don't read the entire columns and then want to know how come they weren't aware of a potential change in fees.)

Now back to the first item. If it's April, it's Opening Day. The rain left, the clouds parted and we had a very nice Opening Day. The clubhouse was decorated beautifully and members provided some delicious appetizers. Visitors arrived from as far away as Fresno and Marina del Rey. Sharon Bufo was the conductor for arranging the event and she had many, many people who were instrumental it making this Opening Day an event that all members can be proud of. Also, my thanks go to the many Staff Commodores who were able to attend. (One note for next year...I anticipate Staff Commodore Michael Measures and a Junior member will, once again, be lingering in the background ready to fire the cannon on queue. Just a guess.)

Next item...Rear Commodore Bob Walker has been working feverishly with the city and the Coastal Commission to get us through the permit process for the replacement of the gangway. He has also been working with the California Department of Boating and Waterways in pursuing a grant to help defer some costs for this project, which was approved by the membership at the November General Meeting. I want to thank Bob for this above-and-beyond effort.

In a related observation, there is a Notice of Development sign now adorning our fence next to the gate. So you are not puzzled when you see this, in the eyes of the Coastal Commission, everything is a development. They don't recognize our maintenance project as anything other than development, so don't think that you missed some major undertaking by the club.

Finally, I would like to share a saying from William A. Ward that you may have seen before, but I think it's worth repeating:

"The Pessimist complains about the wind; The Optimist expects it to change; The Realist adjusts the sails"

It has been a very busy month. A lot of time and energy was spent by many members making final preparations for Opening day. If you missed Opening Day festivities you probably have no idea what a fine job Sharon Bufo and her helpers did putting things together for this annual event.

Besides Opening Day, I have been getting an education. Can you imagine at my age there are still things for me to learn? We have been looking into the possibility of obtaining a grant from the California Dept. of Boating & Waterways to help pay for the new gangway. This work has given me a much better appreciation of how difficult it is to be in complete compliance with ADA requirements. It seems every time I turn around there is some other ADA requirement that needs to be considered in formulating a final design for the project. The first step in preparing for a fund request is to get Coastal Commission approval and obtain a building permit from the City of Morro Bay. After meeting with the City of Morro Bay Inspection and Planning departments, I started on the Coastal Commission's application.

I have spent a great deal of time filling out the California Coastal Commission Application for a Development permit. The first thing I learned is that the repair and replacement of our gangway is considered to be "Development" and will get the same review as a project much larger in scope. The good news is that the application has been sent to the Coastal Commission with our check for \$500.00. I was informed that the Coastal Commission has 30 days to complete their review and because of their workload, we can expect to hear from them on the 29th or 30th day.

So, in the meantime, Carol and I are going to do some traveling and will be departing Morro Bay Tuesday April 24 and will not be back until May 14 or 15th. We are going to visit family in Italy and travel with friends in France. Au revoir!

Most community and Yacht Club youth sailing programs receive support from such foundations.

Recently MBYSF donated an IFJ sailboat to MBYC's youth sailing programs. This process went before the MBYC 2011 Board of directors and was finalized by this years MBYC board. 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
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

We have a new race mark. John Michner, Wayne Ratliff, Pat Hedges, Bob Smirl, Gay Cantwell and Burke Vanderhoff (a non member) who was curious what we were doing and lent a hand- or more accurately: a back- to the project. John had done the heavy work of mixing and casting 5 bags of concrete with rebar and 1 inch chain (donated by Gene Doughty) buried in the block which will anchor the big yellow buoy. Bob Smirl lent his talent in painting the buoy and splicing the rode to the thimbles. Thursday morning was not cooperative with a heavy shower, thankfully brief at 7:30. We were to depart at 8:30 and the sky was brightening then.

We headed out into a dark horizon with refreshing wind and swells higher than hoped. The guys had done a yeoman's job in securing the can with its 300+ pounds of concrete and chain; it did not move until the lines were untied. It sprinkled, it rained, it hailed. With wind and swell it was difficult to hold course for the last minute details of putting it all together. (Sailboats handle better with at least a handkerchief up but not one of the crew brought this fact to the skipper's attention.) It was almost ready for the plunge when a fouled line was noticed. Remove the shackles, overhaul the line and start again. When it was ready for real, John asked the navigator, Wayne, if we were in position. The response was an eager affirmative, whereever that position may have been! The lines were untied and the can was allowed to tumble 180 feet to the bottom.
