#### **Greetings fellow sailors:**

March 4-5, we had our **Mustang Open Regatta** with 29 boats representing 13 universities throughout the state. Saturday morning the sailors were greeted with sunny skies and light to moderate winds. With consistent winds the race committee was able to get off 6 races per division. After a long day of racing, the racers were treated to a spaghetti feast at the yacht club. The teams were welcomed back on Sunday with a pancake breakfast. Showers had rolled through early Sunday morning and many sailors had put on their foul weather gear, but fortunately the showers had dispersed by the time breakfast had concluded. However, the storm produced strong winds and choppy water conditions which put the sailors to the test. Still the race committee could run 5 races per division and ended early by 3 pm.

The Ocean Fleet had the Winter III Race, completing the **Winter Race Series**, on Sunday, March 12. The morning was greeted with five boats competing for top honors, but at the end of the day Guayacan with skipper Lynn Meissen took first place.

**Upcoming races for the Month of April**—April 1 is the infamous Shenanigans race where all boats are welcomed and anything goes. You are only limited by your own imagination. On April 9, we have our Opening Day Ceremonies followed by a Bay Race that is open to all sailors and boats with the Opening Day Perpetual Trophy up for grabs. Then on Saturday April 15, the Daysailer Bay Fleet has their Spring I race. So, let's start the new season with a big bang. Hope to see you all out there.

#### **OCEAN FLEET CAPTAIN—Ken Muther**

The Ocean Fleet completed the Winter Race Series on March 12th. The first race (8 miles) featured a good wind from the shore and the course and wind direction favored big boats. Actually the four boats sailed in two separate races. Guayacan and Whizbang were far ahead with the big boat (Guayacan) crossing the finish line first and Whizbang less than two minutes behind. CC Kelley and Evening Tide were 25 minutes behind Whizbang with CC Kelley 40 seconds ahead of Evening Tide. [Both Whizbang and Evening Tide mentioned their hulls had not been cleaned in a long time. Well, we all need our excuses!]

The Winter II race was longer (11.5 miles) with north wind. Whizbang got her revenge (sort of) and crossed the finish line first, 10 minutes ahead of Pangaea. Pangaea managed to pass Guayacan near the finish and was 19 seconds ahead. But after the handicaps were computed Guayacan was first, Pangaea second and Whizbang in third.

The Winter III race started with strong NW wind. High 5 rounded the MBYC buoy in first place followed by Whizbang and Guayacan. Evening Tide watched from several miles away. The next mark was at Mouse Rock buoy (Cayucos) and the NW wind changed to shifty shore wind for the last mile. All boats had trouble with light wind and frequent wind shifts but Guayacan's strategy worked best and she managed to eventually find good NW wind for the final leg to the finish line. High 5 finished first with Whizbang 30 minutes behind and Guayacan farther back but after the handicaps were computed Guayacan won by 2 minutes.

The Winter Series results were Guayacan 1st (3 points), Whizbang 2nd (8 points) and Evening Tide 3rd (13 points).

Looking ahead, on May 20<sup>th</sup> the Ocean Racing Fleet will be racing to San Simeon, anchoring there for the night and racing home on Sunday. Even if you don't want to race, anyone who would like to join us is welcome. We expect to arrive at San Simeon in time for evening activities on Saturday and won't start the return trip until 1100 so there will be time for all to enjoy their time at beautiful San Simeon Bay. Even if you don't have a boat you might join one of the crews. It would be great to see 10 or more MBYC boats anchored at San Simeon!
