Policy Letter #16 Storage Facility Use

Section A 1-6

1. The storage shed is to be primarily used for the storage of equipment, supplies, and tools related to the upkeep of the MBYC Clubhouse, grounds, and outbuildings.

1a. It shall be the responsibility of the Vice Commodore to be sure that all the above items are stored in a neat and tidy manner.

2. The storage shed is also used for the storage of race committee gear, which includes but is not limited to, markers, lines, flags, buoys, and anchors.

2a. It shall be the responsibility of the Rear Commodore or his/her designee to be sure that

all the above items used for a race day are replaced in a neat and tidy order after each use.

3. The storage shed is also used for items related to the upkeep of the dock, mooring, boat yard, and club safety boat.

3a. It is the responsibility of the Port Captain to keep all of the above items in a neat and tidy order at all times.

4. No fuel, oil, or flammable items may be placed in the shed at any time, per City of Morro Bay Fire Department.

5. No unauthorized personal property shall be stored in the storage shed.

6. Motors or oars used for dinghies may be stored in the building with prior permission being given by the Port Captain and only after all items are properly identified by the member. The storage of such items is only for members with boats on club moorings and dock and is limited to one motor per boat. It is limited to a first come basis due to space limitations.

With the improved weather, dock use is increasing with boats traveling north and south along the coast and their arrival is

unpredictable. When you bring your boat to the dock please tie up to allow maximum space for others, transients and members,

i.e. minimize space between boats and favor the north end. We have an obligation to, and get benefit from, the transients.

Clean Marina

Graywater Water from onboard sinks, washers and showers is called graywater and is discharged directly into the water without treatment. Graywater is often rich in phosphates that encourage growth of un-

wanted algae. Actions you can take:
--Use shore-side laundry and showers whenever possible.
--Limit the amount of water you use in the boat's sinks and showers.

--Use nonphosphate and biodegradable soaps
--Use the smallest amount of cleaning product to get the job done.

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Cal Poly Sailing, Grace Carrick

Making History

CAL POLY SAILING - qualifies for nationals for the first time in history! This is only the second time a CSU team has made it to National Championships. On April 25-28 Cal Poly sailors raced a competitive regatta in Honolulu, HI, for the 2018 Pacific Coast Collegiate Sailing Championship against 11 other universities. Racing against the top west coast teams, the regatta serves as the qualifier for the National Championship. The top 4 teams from qualifiers receive a berth to attend Nationals and Cal Poly didn't give up without a fight!

Sailing into this year, Cal Poly did not expect to qualify due to the team's notorious underdog status. However, Cal Poly ranked 5th behind Stanford, UCSB, USC

and University of Hawaii in the co-ed division. Additionally, after the first day of racing Cal Poly was in 5th place behind Hawaii by only 3 points! College regattas are scored on a low point system throughout a series of 20+ races. For the rest of the regatta, the two teams' scores were never outside of this tight range.

At the beginning of day two, tensions were high and emotions were flowing: no one had expected such close racing. The entire team was overwhelmed with excitement as the last race finished and it dawned on everyone: Cal Poly had finished the regatta with 125 points, just one point ahead of Hawaii, putting the team into 4th place. This is the first time in history the team has qualified to attend

the National Championship, and only the second time a CSU team has made it to Nationals!

Not only was this year monumental in racing, but 4 members of the Cal Poly Varsity team were named All-Conference sailors: Ben Brough (Co-ed Skipper), Josselyn Verutti (Women's Skipper, Nominee for Women's Rookie of the year), Grace Carrick (Co-ed Crew), Grace Vandervort (Co-ed Crew). Sailing is the oldest Club Sport at Cal Poly, founded in 1956.

with "new to us" Lasers. We now have 7 Lasers for our more advanced sailors. Many thanks to the MBYC board for supporting the purchase of the boats. Junior sailing met only once on May 6. We rushed out on the water due to high wind forecasts and the got a few hours of sailing in before the wind gusts hit. Fortunately, the young sailors were unfazed and enjoyed a fun afternoon swimming and playing at the sand spit. On Sunday, May 27 MBYC hosted the Laser Championship, two junior sailors Cole Howe and Nathan Hensinger competed with the adults. Both did great with Nathan placing 3rd and Cole 5th. Junior sailing will meet in June on the 10th and 24th.

Before the Two Sticker race Greg Barker arranged a Man Overboard video for all those who could attend followed by a great discussion. We'll also email out a link to the video. The next safety activity will to practice at the dock with volunteers to jump in the water and be retrieved.

Lots of races to report on for this Masthead. The first is the Spring I race, first in the Spring Series. This race was plagued by long wind lulls and a 180 degree shift in the wind direction about half way through. None of the large boats made the finish but still fun to watch the careful sail placements and strategic navigations by the skippers. First was Janina followed by Whizbang and Far Away.

The second race to report on was Opening Day. The course had some tricky maneuvers around the buoys that weren't typical given the approach. Janina lost some equipment overboard, pulled a "man overboard" maneuver to retrieve it. Far Away took advantage of the situation

to severely close the gap on the speedy Janina. Still, Janina was able to squeak by with the win followed by Far Away only 1:43 later and Guayacan 3rd.

Spring II was a gale of a day. A 38 MPH gust was recorded at the club with the highest wind speed reported at 29.9 MPH during the race. The water, however, was smoother than one would expect. Sails were reefed on most boats which was a really good idea for a day like this. Janina took first followed by a newcomer, Slider, and Guayacan in 3rd. What a day for a new ship to join the fleet.

The last race to report on is the Two Sticker. Designed, as its name suggests, to encourage

boats with two masts to participate. While anyone can race to claim the day, only a two sticker is eligible for the trophy. Another strong, windy day coupled with sharply peaked swells made for very wet crews. Slider took the day, followed by Guayacan and Jessie Marie. Guayacan will get their name this year on the trophy. As an aside, the awards cabinet was empty of first place awards. A volunteer crew cleaning out the storage closets upstairs were kind enough to help us find something suitable. First received a small piñata, while second and third got some noise makers.
