

Policy Letter/By Law POLICY LETTER No.5

Section 5 The Board of Directors shall honor the request of members to have any motion placed before the General Membership for a vote, provided the following is satisfied: The request is made in a written statement bearing the signatures of members in good standing representing at least ten percent (10%) of the club's memberships. The motion is presented to the Board of Directors prior to the close of the Board of Directors meeting that occurs one month prior to the month of the Regular or Special General Meeting in which the motion will be considered. That the membership is notified at least twenty one (21) days prior to the general or special meeting at which the motion will be voted upon. Notification of such a motion can be accomplished using any medium provided that the Board of Directors is reasonably assured that all memberships will be notified. Publication in the club's newsletter shall be considered adequate notification.







There is also a \$5 fee per kayak. Access is easy. There is a small store at the marina to purchase drinks and snacks. The marina also rents kayaks. They have a very limited number of kayaks, and they are rented out on a "first come, first serve" basis. There are no reservations for the kayaks, so to ensure your float it is probably wise to bring your own. As usual, we will do a paddle either up or down the lake - depending on conditions, find a place to picnic, and enjoy lunch, drinks and conversation before heading back. Santa Margarita Lake provides us an opportunity to see wildlife we don't see here on the bay. You may want to bring some binoculars and a camera.



3) Our first June float will be on Monday, June 3rd, and we are planning on paddling over to Bayside Cafe in Morro Bay State Park for lunch. Others who may want to meet us there at lunch time are welcome to go.
