Policy Letter/By Law MORRO BAY YACHT CLUB POLICY LETTER NO. 12 REVISION B TITLE: Bar Use Policy Introduction: This

policy letter outlines the rules that govern use of the MBYC bar by club members and their guests. Policy: 1. Only member of the MBYC and their guests may purchase alcohol at the MBYC bar. a. Guests may purchase alcohol only when accompanied by their member host and only after signing the MBYC bar guest register on each visit to the club. b. Visiting yachtsmen, their crews and their guests are considered to be guests of the club. 2. No alcohol may be purchased by anyone, member or guest, under twenty-one years of age. 3. No alcohol may be consumed by anyone, member or guest, under twenty-one years of age. 4. The tiled area of the MBYC bar is off limits to anyone under twenty-one years of age. 5. No alcohol may be consumed at the club after 2:00 a.m. 6. At no time are non-members or guests allowed behind the bar. 7. No alcohol may be consumed inside the club that has not been purchased at the club unless prior arrangements have been made with the bar steward. 8. The corkage fee applies only to those activities for which a special request for club use has been approved by the board. 9. The bar steward may raise the price of beer and wine by \$1 for any special event. ie: Fourth of July, Lighted Boat Parade, activities for which a special request for club use has been approved by the board.



Black Bean and Corn Salsa:

A Boat-Friendly Snack

32 oz. can black beans drained and rinsed
32 oz. can of corn drained
2 cups of salsa
¼ tsp. cumin
1 Tbsp. lime or lemon juice
4 Tbsp. chopped cilantro (optional)

Mix ingredients together and refrigerate. Serve with tortilla chips, pita rounds or veggie slices.

This healthy snack is perfect for boating trips because it needs no refrigeration until mixed up. If more spice/heat is needed, add ½ tsp. cayenne, hot sauce, finely chopped hot pepper, or chili powder.

No salsa in the galley? Use 2 tomatoes, $\frac{1}{4}$ green pepper, a spicy pepper to taste, and a $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of onion chopped finely instead.

If you have enough grub stowed away in the hatch to make a meal, spoon this salsa over fish, chicken, turkey, or pork.



Etymology 101 - The Origin of a Nautical Idiom Question: What is the origin of the phrase "**By and Large**," meaning all

things considered?

Answer: When the wind blows from a compass point behind a ship's direction of travel (from nearer the stern), for centuries sailors have used the word "Large", the idea being that the ship's forward movement is not restricted. The wind's favorable "large" direction means the largest square sails are set, allowing the ship to travel "freely" in the direction of the skipper's choice with little need to make significant changes to the set sails. Think of other current freedom associations: *a fugitive at large, roaming at large, the public at large*

The term "By" indicates the ship travels into the wind, a more difficult sailing endeavor where the wind blows forward of the beam.: If the ship is accidentally turned too close to the direction of the wind, the sails could be pushed back against the mast, and the ship might stop dead in the water possibly with broken masts. Sails are "aback" when wind blows them against the supporting mast. Were sailors, therefore, surprised or "taken aback" when this happened?

For those early mariners, to sail "by and large" meant sailing square-rigged ships both downwind and against the wind. Triangular sails performed in a similar way to the wings of a plane, thus dragging the ship sideways. Use of a good rudder also came into play. Windjammers from the 19th century, like the Cutty Sark and The Star of India, sailed the oceans "by and large" in good and bad weather using their triangular sails and their most capable crews. -- More word play next month -- J. Roberts




