

Policy Letter/By Law POLICY LETTER NO.6 DOCK USE

"Transient Ocean Boats" are defined as boats whose homeport is somewhere other than Morro Bay, and who have arrived in Morro Bay as a result of an ocean voyage. "Authorized Guest Boats" are boats that have been invited to dock for the night by a MBYC member. They may be boats whose homeport is Morro Bay. "Priority dock use" In the case of the 25 foot "yellow" sailing dinghy zone or the 60 foot "red" member zone on the dock or any part of the dock prior to a club sponsored event. Entitled vessels may request that un-entitled vessels occupying unaffected area move to any unaffected area. Entitled vessels shall be awarded space closest to the dock

This Month's Slice from the Vice

On the ocean, I've been watching to see if an El Niño is going to grace the Pacific this year. Thus far, modeling points to neutral to weak El Niño pattern- similar to last year. At present, weak borderline El Niño conditions continue, and assuming a weak ocean-atmospheric coupling holds and ocean temperature anomalies in Nino3.4 region of the Pacific hold in the +0.8 deg range, there is good probability for slightly enhanced storm production in the South Pacific during the Northern Hemisphere Summer time months (primed by the warmer water).

In short, we should see more south swell production, which is great for surfing. I anticipate the recent wind swell and NW winds we've seen in May and June to dissipate, bringing more "summer-like" light wind conditions mixed with a few windier days for Morro Bay.

That's all for now. I hope to see everyone at Burger Nights and up at Huntington Lake in July! See you on the water! Regards, The Vice

Welcome summer and the June gloom! Below are the race results from June from our fleets. There is one important topic to mention this month. As the only yacht club in Morro Bay we have an important role as ambassadors for boating in our bay. Morro Bay is becoming more and more popular with all types of recreational water sports. We have to be particularly careful that yacht club boating events do not interfere with other users' enjoyment.

An incident during a Day Sailer race brought a complaint to the Harbor Patrol about sailboats being too close, with one boat snagging a kayaker's fishing line. This same fisherman had been grazed in his kayak during a bay race last year. For this reason we are requiring the bay fleet to get training on the navigation rules for recreational craft. The Morro Bay Harbor Patrol will provide this training Saturday, June 29, before the start of the Summer II Bay Race. Reminders will be provided at skipper meetings going forward.

EDUCATION - Greg Barker

A year-and-a- half in the making, the Ocean Fleet finally held its long-planned crew overboard training exercise with auspicious tides, weather, and lack of conflicts on June 1. Two skippers brought their boats out:: John Michener with *Whizbang* and Mark Buchman with *Slider*.

The COB practice would not have been possible without our three volunteers willing to go take a plunge in the bay in the name of crew safety: members John Ridgely and Dan Hack, and Nolan King from the Cal Poly Sailing Team. We were prepared to run three drills at a time but ended up running multiple trials with our two boats.

We gathered about 40 minutes before high slack water and briefed the participants on the approach to the practice. The drills were run off the sides of the boats while tied to the club dock. Our "victims" were instructed to be limp and unhelpful at first, and if the recovery crews were unsuccessful at first, slowly to increase their level of assistance until they were successfully recovered.

Whizbang deployed a Life Sling and tried using a block and tackle secured to the end of the boom. The crew were not able to get the COB high enough to clear the lifelines with that arrangement, and they successfully switched to a masthead halyard.

Slider started by trying to send a bosun's chair from a masthead halyard for the COB but the crew found that they could not keep a limp, unresponsive person in the chair to be hoisted up. They switched to a Life Sling and ran several successful trials, practicing different ways to work their COB into the sling with a boat hook without going into the water themselves.

The most time was spent with unsuccessful first attempts. Once each crew settled into the successful technique, it only took about 3 minutes to recover a limp victim from the water—in the flat waters of the bay. Everyone recognized it would be much different in a seaway.

The lessons taken away from the practice were that Life Slings proved useful, masthead halyards were the best for hoisting the COB, and knowledge about what to do in advance saved critical time. While there was some uncertainty going into the event that it would be productive, everyone agreed in the end it was time well spent.

After the practice, we gathered for a **Bring Your Own Meat** barbecue, with our volunteer COB's treated to rib eye steaks. We also want to extend our thanks to other members of the club who joined us and helped with the galley work.

From the Galley: Cranberry Orange Coleslaw

Salad:

- 3 oz. package oriental ramen noodles with
- seasoning packet (uncooked)
- 4 cups chopped cabbage
- 11 oz. can drained mandarin oranges
- 1/2 cup dried cranberries
- 1/2 cup lightly salted cashews
- 3 Tbsp. thinly sliced green onion tops, divided **Dressing:**

1⁄₃ cup olive oil


1/3 cup balsamic or red wine vinegar

2 tsp. Sugar

Oriental seasoning packet from ramen noodles **Instructions:**

- 1. Crumble dry ramen noodles.by putting them in a baggy and hitting with a hammer gently. Put noodles in medium bowl.
- 2. Add cabbage, oranges, cranberries, cashews, and 2 Tbsp. green onions.
- 3. Mix dressing ingredients thoroughly and toss evenly with salad mix.
- 4. Garnish with remaining onion.

If you want the cashews and ramen to be crunchy, serve this dish immediately. This recipe is great with fish, or underway it can be lunch with leftover chicken or brats sliced on top.






FJ Campaign Closes


