Launch Certification Required

The recently established Launch Safety Committee has finalized a checklist that members must meet to be allowed to operate the club launches. We have five volunteers to be the examiners to ensure members can safely and correctly use the launches. They are: Lynn Meissen, Greg Barker, Troy Wieck, David Hensinger, and Chris Surfleet. A binder will be maintained in the upstairs library adjacent to club policy letters and sailing race deeds. In the binder will be a list of members certified to operate the launch. The committee has "grandfathered" several members to be existing and approved launch operators. Assume you are NOT on this list. A copy of the launch oper-

ator required checklist is included. We recommend you familiarize yourself with the checklist then contact an examiner to get checked out. Experience with the launch is important and can be accomplished by use of the launch with approved operators.

One of the important requirements for launch use is members

must have a California Boater Card to operate motorized boats, this is a state requirement. To get a California Boater Card you must complete an approved safety course, many options are available online as well as locally by the Coast Guard Auxiliary. The

California Boater Card requirement is being phased in per the schedule below.

- January 1, 2020 Persons 35 years of age or younger
- January 1, 2021 Persons 40 years of age or younger
- January 1, 2022 Persons 45 years of age or younger
- January 1, 2023 Persons 50 years of age or younger
- January 1, 2024 Persons 60 years of age or younger
- January 1, 2025 All persons regardless of age

Door and Windows

February saw some needed maintenance to our sliding doors and blinds. Many thanks to some great volunteers! New blinds were added or repaired at the stairway and lower front windows and upper sliding doors. Many thanks to Andrea Surfleet for selecting and purchasing the correct replacements and thanks to perspective member Ralph Lewis plus Todd Hansen and Scott Irwin for installing them. Several rollers on the sliders were replaced or cleaned. Additional thanks to Bill Albrecht and perspective member Bryan Griffiths for their work. The galley dutch door needs some attention. John Burgener has volunteered to see if it can be repaired; if not a new door will be installed.

Upper Deck Attention

A plan is coming together for re-doing the upper deck. Advisement from Dana McClish and Tom Fee have a plan taking shape. It is proposed that the current decking material be removed and discarded. This will allow access to make repairs and seal any trouble spots to the deck joists. A new plywood

decking would be applied on a cant to allow water drainage with a water-proof layer applied over the plywood. New deck boards will be applied for the walking surface to complete the re-model. This approach will make the upper deck an impervious roof over the repaired joists and ground below. Additionally, it will

provide a roof to simplify the proposed pantry/closet addition proposed by the galley. We are targeting September to do the work over several weekends. Lots of helpers will be needed!

The Chris Lockwood Regatta 2020










The first race I ended up last. The next 2 races I moved up one spot to 2nd from last. I was kind of glad I wasn't last.



The focus of this workshop is learning, understanding and applying marine navigation using physical charts and mechanical tools (compass, divider, parallel rules). We all have electronic devices which is what most of us use on a regular basis for navigating, but there are no batteries or electronic failures when using paper charts. Understanding the fundaments and shortcomings of electronic navigation will keep us all safer on the water.

Lectures will comprise 1/3 of the two-day workshop spread between group exercises to allow time to become comfortable understanding and using the tools of navigation. Coast Guard Auxiliarist will be available to work with individuals. This is a great opportunity to become familiar with a key component of planning a day or longer excursion out of port, and it's also a lot of fun! All experience levels welcome. Upcoming workshops:

T/T Tender To

ost of you know that all boats stored on club property, long term or short, must be identified with the owner's name, or, in the case of the skiffs on the dinghy dock with the standard T/T (Tender to) mother boat name. I recently removed the below inflatable from the water because it has been unattended for a very long time- so long that eel grass has started growing on the bottom - not just barnacles - but eel grass. One pontoon is deflated, the gas can has water in it and there was gas in the water which had accumulated in the boat. I did send a message via the alias inquiring for the owner with no positive response. The board has been informed of this situation and agreed that further steps must be taken which will result in the sale of the boat and motor which appears to be in fair condition.

If your skiff is not identified, please do so in the most visible way on the inside of the transom.

Soaps from boat washing, sinks and showers are more harmful than those at home because they have not been treated in a sanitary sewer before being discharged overboard.

- Use shore-side facilities showers, sinks, laundry
- If not available, save showers, laundry, and dishwashing for home
- Use more "elbow grease" less cleaning products.
- Try to skip the boat wash. Unless you need to rinse the salt water, wiping the boat down with a damp cloth will suffice.



Use tarps or canvas boat covers to keep boat clean between trips
Use less toxic laundry detergents, soaps, drain openers, cleaners etc.
