## Club security. Dock rules. Opening Day

February has seen some changes! COVID cases have come down and the state and local order's and guidance have changed. As a club, we remain compliant with these changes effective February 16th in our county:

- ☐ Universal masking shall remain required only in specified settings.
- ☐ Only unvaccinated persons are required to mask in all Indoor Public Settings. Fully vaccinated individuals are recommended to continue indoor masking when the risk may be high.

# Race date changes coming



Probably the most important news to share is that the Spring I DaySailer race date has been changed from the 5th of March to the 12th of March. We had a conflict with the Mustang Regatta and decided to reduce confusion on the dock, so again, the Spring I Bay Race is March 12th.

We will probably be changing many of the race dates, perhaps the bay races as well as the ocean races to better accommodate all of our sailors. Many of the new SC27 fleet members are also members of our Bay Fleets, and they would like to see the races on different weekends rather than the same for two reasons: reducing traffic on the dock and allowing the racers not to have to do two races on a weekend. We will post any of the changed dates when the decisions have been made.

Every year we should have our safety boats tuned up. This month we pulled the big Whaler out of the bay and took it over to Atascadero for a tuneup and regular maintenance. I would really like to thank Charlie Nichols for using his truck to take it over and bring it back. I would also like to thank John Edell for taking care of the whalers and scheduling the needed support.



Winter III and Founders Cup - Silvia Suarez and Dan Hack were the PROs for Bay Winter III, and they carried off a well organized race. They raced two fleets on a rolling start. The Cal Poly members wanted to participate with the FJ Fleet, so they started five minutes after every Daysailer start. We ended up giving trophies and awards to both fleets.

Glenda Boatman is in charge of setting up trophies and awards. This year we are trying something a little different. Glenda is purchasing gift certificates from local merchants, including our own club store. At the last bay race Glenda gave the winners the option of either the glass trophy or a gift certificate. They all chose the gift certificates. Glenda has also purchased a sufficient amount of glassware trophies for those who prefer the glassware.

**We are still looking for a fleet captain for the Daysailer Fleet 128.** One of our bay racers should volunteer for this position; it is an important position with several responsibilities.

## Be sure you know your Happy Hour dates

Great news: the IPO for the **Kurmudgeon Kuryo-Koin** is well underway, and we all (at least the MBYC Members who purchase our **Kuryo-Koins**) are destined to become very rich. As we indicated last month, the IPO price per **Kuryo-Koin is set to start at \$1000**, and with current projections we expect the cost to balloon to 20 times that in the first few hours after opening. We are in contact with the MBYC finance director, and we, the **Kurmudgeons**, propose that all YC “set aside” funds should be turned into **Kuryo-Koins**. This would, in turn, result in a massive influx to our treasury. This added income will be a

golden opportunity for the YC to invest in some of the fantastic projects that the **Kurmudgeons** have advocated in the past. Also, we plan to meet with officials from the **City of Morro Bay** to permit them, using their reserve funds, to purchase **Kuryo-Koins** at the IPO start price. By doing this we hope to enlist them in our next project. More on that below.

It has come to the attention of **The Kurmudgeon Scientific Exploratory and Development Committee** that a company, **Spinlaunch Inc**, is developing a centrifugal device to spin space packages to a high rate and then launch them into orbit. This information rekindled our thoughts on a program we have long felt needed to be implemented. We are, of course, referring to the utilization the Morro Bay smokestacks.

Our proposal is to build a large plenum chamber connected to the bottom of the stacks to store high pressure atmospheric air. (**The Kurmudgeons are not polluters.**) The space vehicle/package will be located in the base of the stacks. The pumps that compress the air will also be used to create a vacuum in the upper part of the stacks.

At launch the two hatches, one separating the plenum from the stack base and the other holding the vacuum at the top of the stack, are opened simultaneously and the package is fired into space with a resounding **boom**. We have decided to name our devices **The Kurmudgeons’ Fast Air Research Tubes**.



The initial test may result in some minor complaints about the noise when a tube fires. It will be a very distinctive sound. The problem may be exacerbated if we “ripped off” all three in succession. These, however, are not big concerns, they are just technical problems to be worked out later. Since Morro Bay will become the West Coast satellite launch center, we expect the city to provide the majority of the startup funding. This would minimize the MBYC's cost, and, as you know, the **Kurmudgeons are always concerned about costs**. Since we expect the city to pour prodigious sums purchasing **Kuryo-Koins** they, as a result, will be in a position of having prodigious sums of surplus moneys. We, the **Kurmudgeons**, ask, "Where better to spend it than to create **Space Port Morro Bay?**"
