The biggest topic from the normal board meeting this month was Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) Compliance. Beginning July 1st, 2022 we need to be compliant with the new regulation requiring that anyone serving others alcohol needs to be RBS certified. The board listened to legal advice, solicited information from other volunteer yacht clubs, and consulted with the ABC directly. Our bar use policy letter was amended to require this compliance. To help out with



fulfilling this requirement see the flyer in this masthead. Get your certification going at https://abcbiz.abc.ca.gov (you can find the link in the Member Area of our website). The club will reimburse you up to \$15 after you get certified and provide proof of payment to our Treasurer. Help us all stay compliant and safe!

Club Security is another big topic at the board meeting. Our Vice is working on a solution to help increase our club security against theft and unwanted intrusion without disturbing or impinging on club use and

An interesting event has happened to the **Kurmudgeons** since our last report. 
Boat Measurement Day - Getting Ready for the Big Regattas

2022 Day Sailer North American Championship Regatta, to be held July 26th through the 31st in Eugene, Oregon.






