Proposal for change in Elevator Funds and Dues November 16th, 2022 - MBYC General Meeting

Due to funds accumulated since 2009 for an elevator from both membership dues and donations not sufficient to build an elevator today, nor for the next 40 years, this proposes:

1. That the club focus on servicing, repairing and upgrading when necessary the chairlift on the stairs on the south side of the club.

- 2. That the \$25 of membership dues currently being allocat ed to the restricted elevator reserve fund be now devoted to the chair lift for service, repairing and upgrading when necessary and any excess within the budget calendar year be allocated to a chair lift unrestricted reserve fund.
- 3. That the current elevator restricted reserve fund be moved to the chair lift unrestricted reserve fund and the elevator restricted reserve fund be dissolved.
- 4. That the current restricted elevator donation be dissolved. Those active members whom the club has record of donating will have until 12/31/2022 to request their donations bereturned or designated to another fund. After 12/31/2022 any amount remaining in the fund will be moved to the chair lift unrestricted reserve fund.
- 5. That the current unrestricted elevator fund be moved to the chair lift unrestricted fund and the unrestricted elevator fund be dissolved.

This proposal also recommends, but does not require, that the chair lift be regularly professionally serviced throughout the year.







MORRO BAY YACHT CLUB POLICY LETTER NO. 12 REVISION E

TITLE: Bar Use Policy

Introduction:

This policy letter outlines the rules that govern use of the MBYC bar by club members and their guests.

Policy:

- 1. Only member of the MBYC and their guests may purchase alcohol at the MBYC bar.
- a. Guests may purchase alcohol only when accompanied by their member host and only after signing the MBYC bar guest register on each visit to the club.
- b. Visiting yachtsmen, their crews and their guests are considered to be guests of the club.
- 2. No alcohol may be purchased by anyone, member or guest, under twenty-one years of age.
- 3. No alcohol may be consumed by anyone, member or guest, under twenty-one years of age.
- 4. The tiled area of the MBYC bar is off limits to anyone under twenty-one years of age.
- 5. No alcohol may be consumed at the club after 2:00 a.m.
- 6. At no time are non-members or guests allowed behind the bar.
- 7. No alcohol may be consumed inside the club that has not been purchased at the club unless prior arrangements have been made with the bar steward, or unless a corkage fee has been paid.
- 8. The bar steward may raise the price of beer and wine by \$1 for any special event. ie: Fourth of July, Lighted Boat Parade, activities for which a special request for club use has been approved by the board.
- 9. No storage of personal alcohol on the premises.
- 10. Anyone serving alcoholic beverages on the premises must be a state certified Responsible Beverage Server.



Sailing Instructions

Rules: Races will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) (2021-2024), the prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association, the rules of the various participating fleet association as applicable, and these Sailing Instructions. The races will be conducted using the Kurmudgeon Khapstick Handicapping system in which a boats finishing time is divided by her handicap to obtain her corrected time. See below for the class handicaps.

Skippers' Meeting and Changes: There will be a Skippers' meeting at 10:30 a.m. Any changes to these instructions will be announced at the meeting and posted on the official bulletin board.

Signals: RRS Part 3 – 26 Starting Races Sound-Signal Starting sequence will be used for all race starts.

Scoring:

The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply.

Courses and Marks

Start between yellow float and the club yardarm. Finish between 14 and the club yardarm. All marks to port unless designated with an 's', then take it to starboard.

Course 1 Start - A - Grassey Island to port - C - E - Finish

Course 2 Start - 17s - 16 - A - Grassey Island to

port - C - E- Finish

Course 3 Start - 12 - 16 - Finish

Course 4 Start - 16 - 12 - Finish

In the event that courses 1 & 2 are <u>too short</u> the Kommittee may raise the Tango flag to indicate twice around. Additional courses may be added at the skippers' meeting.



Shortening Course:

The course can be shortened between a committee boat flying the 'S' flag and any mark of the course.

The 'S' flag may also be flown at the club's yardarm causing the finish between the 'S' flag and 14.

Number of races.

The race committee will attempt to complete 5 (Five) races however completion of one race will be enough to constitute a regatta.
