
And alcohol and boating don't mix. If you notice someone over indulging, talk to them. We don't need a statistic associated with our club and "the law will come down on all of us."

Scholarships for youth sailing lessons at the Morro Bay Yacht Club are available for local youth ages 8 to 18. 

It is the zigzag icon at the bottom of the panels. It doesn't matter which zigzag you choose. Selecting the zigzag will show all the weather in a one day graph format. You can change the length of the time period being graphed by choosing the date on top right just above the first graph. It is very interesting to look at it over two or three days, a week, or even a month.


Welcome three new members




<u>Prospective members</u>, in addition to those mentioned in the last edition of the Masthead, include:
