

FLEET 128 TRAILER MAINTENANCE WORKSHOP

We had a "maybe-someday-annual" workshop in April to demonstrate how to take care of trailer bearings. A half dozen folks came out and we had a good discussion about Bearing Basics, and even a demonstration on how to replace races, bearings and seals in your trailer. It can be a mess, but necessary to keep your Day Sailer ready for the road. Don't forget we have High Sierra at Huntington Lake in July and the two-day Wysocki planned for Santa Margarita Lake on June 15 and 16. You still have a lot of time to get the trailer out, pull the hubs off, clean, inspect, grease or repair and have a good trip to the next "away game" with your Day Sailer. In case you're not one of the luck-half-dozen that came in person there are a couple easy ways to get up to speed. 

Why is the swivel wheel on the club hoist

Heard around the tarmac the other day is that there was a "mystery artist" that painted the swivel for the hoist red and green on opposite sides. It's no mystery. First, here's a photo:

You'll notice that about half of the swivel wheel is painted green and half is red. This is not some kind of festive paint job - it is important for those operating the hoist to know what it means. Simply this shows the hoist operator the range that the swivel can be safely rotated. There are Limit switches" that will stop the crane from swiveling too





far. The paint shows where the limit switches will be actuated as the hoist rotates. In the photo below you can see one of the fingers that will actuate the limit switch and in the lower center of the photo (behind the drive chain) you can see the switch with a lever pointing upward. (In the photo you can also see local sailing legend Carlton Smith pondering the paint job!)

Next time you're at the club please look over the swivel of the hoist and you will see how the switches are set and the limits of the rotation. If you happen to go past the limit, the crane will no longer operate. If you have questions, ask Lynn Meissen, Chuck Losness, or others until someone can explain the operation for you.
