
Ahoy from bridge

- ·Wash the bar towels
- Scrub tile floor around the bar boat
- •Asses and suggest an appropriate new anti-slam front door closer
- •Identify a new spot light outside the front door to illuminate our sign
- •Come up with a solution for a motion sensor for our porch lights.
- •Give our ships bell a good polish
- Lubricate all padlocks
- •Re-Lash the pennants on dock pilings
- Clean and organize the storage yard
- •Clean the carpet with a heavy duty cleaner (not to be done on work day)

- •Paint ladies restroom (not on work day)
- Remove weeds in brick out front

Feel free to make more suggestions.


Thanks to Commodore Tom for securing a replacement fridge for beer kegs. That will help save Stanley's back.



Shallow water in MB channel reported to Coast Guard

We wanted to update boaters of Morro Bay Harbor of some changes in the navigation channel in Morro Bay. The Harbor Patrol recently put a Hazard buoy out between the #10 and #8 day markers to warn boaters of increased shoaling along that entire section on the sandspit side of the channel. Keep center channel and make sure to go around the #8 properly.

We have also noticed several high spots center channel between the #14 and #17 markers. Watch your depths while transiting through this area especially at a lower tide. Some areas only have 4-5'.

We are in communication with the Coast Guard Aids to Navigation Team and the Army Corp of Engineers for dredging and buoy placement and hope to mitigate these issues as soon as possible. Dredging is planned for the Harbor Entrance in May and the inner harbor main channel in December of this year.

It is now the law. Thanks to the Recreational Boaters of California (RBOC) this card IS NOT tied to the DMV, and therefore is good for life once you pass the test.

As a Yacht Club it is in good diligence for all of us to set a good example around such topics. Please everybody, obtain your card, it's a one-time deal.


