


The Club is looking rather ship shape with work days a big success. Thank you to all those who participated. Remember, we are an all-volunteer club and you do not have to wait for work day to help out.


Spring General Meeting is Saturday April 5 at 6 pm.


Repair rather than replace entire dock possible







Stink-pots and sails -- 70 years

Next year we'll celebrate our 70th anniversary as a volunteer boat club, built from the water up, that has been an important part of the boating community in Morro Bay for many years.

Formed in 1956 by the young sailing family of Ken Jenkins, and a retired stink-Celebration
Planning group forming and seeking ideas for celebrating. pot (motor boat) owner, Barney Pike, they were introduced by friends who heard them both asking about a boating group.

In Ken's words, "Barney Pike and I both agreed that what the area needed was a boat club for all comers, whether they were fishermen or stink potters or sail boat people. Of course, there were only about three sailors in the area at that time."

They spread the word that a club was to form and twenty people met at Barney Pike's home in the little bunker house at 180 Main Street, at the corner of Piney Way. That was likely in the spring of 1956.

They quickly organized themselves with officers and held meetings in the Grange Hall. Dues were \$1 per month with initiation fees of \$5 for family membership and \$3 for singles.

By April 1957, the Morro Bay Yacht Club was recognized as a non-profit corporation whose primary purpose was to promote boating. The thirty-three charter members stepped immediately into that role. Since then, the MBYC has helped

Fun Floats allow prospective members a chance to participate in "on the water" club activities. Anyone is welcome to participate. Fun Floats members and prospective members interact with each other in a very fun and relaxed way as well as to enjoy nature and the wonders of the Bay.

I would like to encourage any club member or prospective member to come and join us for a short float outing.

Our Fun Floats take place just about every two weeks. Members whose paddle craft are







stored on the dock should certainly get them out on the water with friends and not just use our paddle craft racks for storage space.

ASA classes begin with discounts available

The first of the ASA sailing courses for 2025 is going to set sail on April 4-5-12. There are two people signed up and room for 1 more. Check the Yacht Club web site to sign up and for future courses. In 2024 there were 12 participants with 8 certified and one with partial completion. Students spend about 10 hours in the bay sailing and crewing. The balance of the time is spent rigging the boat, reviewing the work book, terminology and learning knots. Completion of the 20 hour course will have participants proficient in

safely handling up to a 30 ft. sailboat.
